Article II of the N.C. Constitution

Section 1. Legislative Power

The legislative power of the State shall be vested in the General Assembly, which shall consist of a Senate and a House of Representatives.

Section 2. Number of Senators

The Senate shall be composed of 50 Senators, biennially chosen by ballot.

Section 4. Number of Representatives

The House of Representatives shall be composed of 120 Representatives, biennially chosen by ballot.

Section 24(4). General Laws

The General Assembly may enact general laws regulating the matters set out in this Section.

To The Reader

An informed electorate is the essence of democratic government, but more than a general understanding of important issues is required if government is to fully serve the public's interests. Informed citizens must also know something about the men and women elected to serve them as legislators. This book has been prepared to acquaint the people of North Carolina with their state senators and representatives.

The thirteenth edition of *Article II* provides concise, yet comprehensive, information about each member of the 2001–2002 North Carolina General Assembly. The first edition covered the 1977–78 legislature. Each senator and representative has been individually profiled in a manner that will quickly tell the reader:

- how to contact each legislator by mail, phone, fax, or e-mail;
- the legislator's occupation and educational background;
- what kind of bills the legislator introduced in 1999–2000, and his or her success in getting them passed; and
- how he or she voted on a range of issues of statewide interest during the past two sessions.

In addition, members of the General Assembly who served in the 1999 session and other sessions since 1981 were ranked according to the results of a survey of the "effectiveness" of each senator and representative.

All of this information has been organized so it can be readily understood and interpreted, and so legislative activities of various incumbents can be easily compared. Sources used in the preparation of Article II include: (1) The North Carolina Manual, prepared by the Office of the Secretary of State; (2) the North Carolina General Assembly Senate and House Rules Directories; (3) North Carolina Legislation 1999 and North Carolina Legislation 2000, published by the N.C. Institute of Government; (4) BellSouth Telecommunications' North Carolina Legislative Directory; (5) Center surveys of first-time legislators; (6) official roll call vote sheets kept in the legislative library; (7) lists of bills by introducer available at www.ncleg.net; and (8) various other legislative listings produced by the principal clerks for the House and Senate and by the staff of the North Carolina General Assembly and also available at www.ncleg.net.

Every effort has been made to verify sources and to rectify apparent discrepancies. Each legislator was given the opportunity to review his or her profile page in draft form for accuracy. We publish this book solely for the purpose of making information about state legislators more accessible, and thus more meaningful, to the people of North Carolina.

How To Use This Book

Profiles of the members of the North Carolina General Assembly are ordered alphabetically within the sections designated Senate and House of Representatives. The legislator's party affiliation, district, county of residence, date of birth, counties in district, addresses, and telephone numbers are listed below his or her name. Terms served are noted to the right, with any terms served in the other chamber listed in parentheses. Additional information explaining portions of the profile data is detailed below under headings keyed to the profiles themselves.

- -- If you desire information about a particular legislator, simply turn to the page on which his or her profile is placed in alphabetical order within the Senate or the House.
- If you desire information about legislators representing a particular Senate or House district, use the index by district which appears at the beginning of the section for each chamber and then locate the legislator's profile according to alphabetical order.
- If you desire information about legislators who represent various regions of the state, use the map which appears at the beginning of the section for each chamber to determine which districts are in that region. Use the index by district to identify the legislators representing those districts, and then locate each legislator's profile in alphabetical order.

Selected Bills Introduced 1999–2000

For re-elected members, the number and the abbreviated title or subject matter of five bills introduced by the legislator during the 1999–2000 term appear in this section. Bills listed are usually *public* bills (statewide rather than local) for which the legislator was the *principal* sponsor. In selecting a legislator's five bills, the Center showed a preference for ratified bills and those dealing with subjects which related to committees on which the legislator served or which he or she chaired. If the legislator introduced fewer than five public bills, local bills may also be listed.

The "Action" indicated is the final disposition of the bill as of the end of the 1999–2000 session. All bills and resolutions not ratified automatically expire at the conclusion of each biennial term of the General Assembly. The following abbreviations are used in the "Action" column:

The final action taken on each bill is compiled and published by the General Assembly, and that is the information used by the Center to compile this section. Previously, the Assembly included a notation (RPAB) when a bill was ratified as part of another bill, which occurred most frequently when small appropriations bills were ratified as part of the larger state budget bill. That information is no longer being recorded by the legislature. Also, it is not unusual for identical bills to be introduced in both chambers. In such situations, only one of these bills can be ratified. If one of them is ratified, the companion identical bill is not reported as ratified. These factors may artificially lower the number of bills on which a legislator was actually successful.

Where He/She Stands 1999–2000

Fifteen bills which generated statewide attention during the 1999–2000 sessions are listed on each legislator's profile, along with an indication of the vote on the measure in the appropriate chamber and the

vote cast by the legislator, if he or she was a member at the time the vote was taken.

- S 6, Use of Tobacco Lawsuit Settlement Funds: Approves creation of a nonprofit corporation to distribute economic assistance funds to tobacco dependent regions and other areas affected by settlement of the state's lawsuit against five tobacco companies. The corporation will have 15 members on its board of directors, five each appointed by the Governor, Senate President Pro Tempore, and House Speaker to include representatives of tobacco, health, and economic development interests. The corporation will distribute fifty percent of the settlement funds; the remainder will be divided equally between two trust funds established by the Assembly. One trust fund will benefit health; the other will assist tobacco interests that have suffered economic loss and will help revitalize tobacco dependent communities. Both funds will be administered by boards of trustees representative of the funds' respective interests. A House Committee Substitute passed third reading in the House by 61-58, and the Senate concurred by 34-14. Ratified 3/16/99 and signed by the Governor.
- S 12, Appoint Not Elect Appellate Judges: Would have amended the N.C. Constitution so that N.C. Supreme Court Justices and N.C. Court of Appeals Judges would no longer be selected in partisan elections. Instead, they would be appointed initially by the Governor (after recommendations from a Judicial Nomination Commission in the Senate version of the bill) and subject to periodic nonpartisan retention elections. A 3/5 vote of the Senate and House is required to submit constitutional amendments to the voters. An amended Senate Committee Substitute for S 12 passed third reading in the Senate by 38-11. The House defeated a House Committee Substitute for the Senate bill by 55-57 on 6/29/99.
- S 76, Traffic Enforcement Statistics: Requires the Justice Department to collect and correlate 14 items of information related to traffic stops by law officers in order to determine if there is racial discrimination in motor vehicle law enforcement. Such items include the driver's race or ethnicity, age and gender; the reason for the stop; whether a search was conducted, and if so, the results; and whether force was used and if injuries resulted. Exempts roadblocks from reporting requirements unless some adverse action was taken following the stop. An amended House Committee Substitute for S 76 passed third reading in the House by 77-33. The Senate approved the House Committee Substitute by 43-6. Ratified 4/14/99 and signed by the Governor.
- S 90, Health Insurance Cover Contraceptives: Requires health insurers that pay for prescription drugs to also cover prescription contraceptive drugs and devices under the same terms (same deductibles, co-payments, etc.). Health plans must also cover outpatient contraceptive services to the extent they cover other outpatient services. Applies to Blue Cross Blue Shield of North Carolina, state-

regulated HMOs, and all other state-regulated health benefit plans, except those offered by religious employers as defined in the bill and those offering specified limited benefits. An amended House Committee Substitute for S 90 passed third reading in the House by 69-40 and was approved by the Senate by 46-2. Ratified 6/23/99 and signed by the Governor.

- —S 333, Gender Equity/State Board Appointments: Encourages appointment of women to all state and local boards and commissions by providing that appointing authorities should make appointments that accurately reflect each gender's proportion in the state as a whole, or in the case of local boards, the population served by the board. Annual reports disclosing gender information on each board's previous year's appointments must be made by each December 1 to the N.C. Secretary of State, and, in the case of local boards, also to the city or county clerk. Encourages gender equity but does not require appointments to or removals from boards based on gender. Senate passed the Conference Report by 43-2; the same measure then passed the House by 77-36. Ratified 7/20/99 and signed by the Governor.
- S 568, One-Stop Early Voting/Designated Sites: Permits new early voting in general elections held in November of evennumbered years at one-stop voting sites. Early voting can occur
 between the first business day after the 25th day before an election
 and 5:00 pm on the Friday before the election. Absentee voting qualification standards do not apply to in-person, one-stop "no-excuse"
 voting. One-stop voting can be held at a county elections board office
 or any other site(s) in the county approved by unanimous vote of all
 members of the local elections board and by the State Board of Elections. Amends procedures related to absentee voting and permits
 applicants for absentee ballots to apply by and vote via facsimile or
 electronic mail. Senate passed the Conference Report by 36-10, and
 the House approved it by 60-53. Ratified 7/20/99 and signed by the
 Governor.
- —S 881, Stand By Your Political Ad: Prohibits political campaign advertisements without the sponsor's name being disclosed in compliance with specific standards. Places additional in-person disclosure requirements on television and radio ads that support or oppose nomination or election of specific candidates, including requiring a full-screen picture of the disclosing person in TV ads. Permits recovery of monetary damages by a candidate who met all disclosure requirements against an opponent who did not. Prohibits anonymous political contributions, and expands existing ban on contributions while General Assembly is in session by prohibiting lobbyists from soliciting contributions on behalf of individual Council of State members or legislators. House approved an amended Committee Substitute for S 881 on third reading by 89-21; the Senate approved the same measure by 36-9. Ratified 7/20/99 and signed by the Governor.

- S 953, Improve Ambient Air Quality: Enacts comprehensive program to reduce ground level ozone pollution from motor vehicles by means which include: (1) limiting sulfur content in gasoline sold in N.C.; (2) requiring specified motor vehicle emissions testing beginning in nine named counties and increasing to at least 48 named counties by 1/1/06, provided the emissions inspection fee is raised; (3) setting phased-in goals for state and local government purchases of cars, trucks, school buses, and public transportation vehicles that run on alternative fuels or meet low emission standards; (4) developing plans to reduce commuting and other job-related miles traveled by state and private sector employees, and (5) requiring state and regional transportation planning to minimize adverse effects on air quality. House passed House Committee Substitute for S 953 on third reading by 82-30, and the Senate approved the House measure by 34-12. Ratified 7/20/99 and signed by the Governor.
- S 1134, Welfare Reform Changes: Makes support services under Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) State Plan available to families with incomes up to 200% of federal poverty level. Permits N.C. Department of Health and Human Services to fund pilot programs to help families with major employment barriers to economic self-sufficiency and lists desired target outcomes. Permits up to 20% of TANF (state "Work First" welfare reform program) recipients to substitute part-time postsecondary education for other kinds of work-related activities required to maintain TANF payments. Allows DHHS to reduce funding to counties that do not meet Work First program standards and support requirements. Requires counties to review each Work First case at least three months before cash assistance expires and inform family of other services for which it remains eligible, etc. and requires all counties to have an emergency assistance program for Work First eligible families. Requires DHHS and N.C. Dept. of Transportation to develop ways to assist low-wage workers receiving TANF assistance to meet their needs for transportation to work, child-care, and education. Conference Report passed Senate by 33-12 and House by 53-47. Ratified 7/21/99 and signed by the Governor.
- S 1149, Prohibit Predatory Lending: Prevents specific practices in connection with certain home loans. Provisions include: (1) a ban on prepayment fees or penalties on home loans under \$150,000; (2) a specific list of fees and charges permitted and prohibited in connection with such loans; (3) restrictions on "high-cost home loans" (loans up to \$300,000 with total points and fees in excess of specified amounts), including no balloon payments, no acceleration of due dates for payments, and no lending without homeownership counseling and proper consideration of repayment ability; and (4) a ban on certain described unfair and deceptive practices in connection with all consumer home loans, including (a) repeatedly refinancing loans when the new loan is of no benefit to the borrower ("flipping") and (b) financing credit life, disability, or unemployment

insurance premiums, except as calculated and paid monthly. The Legislative Research Commission will study the law's effect on availability of credit in N.C. and make a final report to the 2002 General Assembly. House Committee Substitute for S 1149 passed second reading in House by 109-1. The Senate approved the House Committee Substitute by 47-2. Ratified 7/15/99 and signed by the Governor.

- S 1275, Extend I-40 Billboard Moratorium: Extends 1999 moratorium on issuing permits for or constructing new billboards on a section of Interstate 40 between the Orange-Alamance County line and the Wilmington municipal limits. Moratorium expires July 1, 2001. Passed second reading in Senate by 29-10 and third reading by voice vote. Passed second reading in House by 68-45 and third reading by 67-42. Ratified 7/7/00 and signed by the Governor.
- —S 1542, Ban Video Poker Machines: Makes it unlawful to operate or keep any video gaming machine (defined as slot machine and other mechanical or computer game that requires payment to activate) unless machine was already in operation before 6/30/00 and listed for taxes by 1/31/00. No more than three machines allowed at same location. Machines must be registered with county sheriff and activity reports must be filed with N.C. Dept. of Revenue. Exempts certain pinball and other machines that do not pay off in cash or in goods worth \$10 or more, machines built for sale in other states, and machines operated on federally-recognized Indian Tribe property. Conference Report adopted by Senate 30-2 and by House 92-8. Ratified 7/13/00 and signed by the Governor.
- H 1133, Allow Lawsuits Against Health Plans/HMOs: Would have made managed health care plans subject to legal liability for harm caused by the plan's failure to use ordinary care in making health care treatment decisions involving one of its enrollees. Would not have created liability for employers that purchased health care coverage for employees nor imposed additional liability on the patient's health care providers. Passed third reading in the House by 88-22 on 7/19/99. H 1133 was referred to the Senate Judiciary I Committee, which never sent it to the full Senate for a vote.
- H 1160, Clean Water; No New Hog Farms/Lagoons: Enacts comprehensive water quality measures, including provisions to: (1) extend the moratoria on new or expanded swine farms until 7/1/01; (2) add a third county to the pilot program to inspect all animal waste management systems at least annually; (3) require the N.C. Department of Environment and Natural Resources to inventory all inactive animal waste lagoons; (4) increase most civil penalties for violating water quality laws to a maximum of \$25,000; (5) help fund the Wetlands Restoration and Conservation Reserve Enhancement Programs; (6) authorize temporary measures to protect certain river basins; (7) require reports to users on wastewater treatment system performance and to the press in case of discharges

of untreated wastewater from treatment or animal waste management systems; (8) limit new permits to municipal or domestic wastewater treatment works intending to discharge into the state's surface waters; (9) amend procedures for allocating clean water grants; and (10) require various studies of untreated wastewater discharges and septic tank systems and their effects. Conference Report passed the Senate by 45-0 and was adopted by the House by 83-30. Ratified 7/20/99 and signed by the Governor.

— H 1630, Private Toll Road Pilot Project: Authorizes one pilot private toll road project to operate under a license from the N.C. Department of Transportation. The license must be issued by 7/1/03 and will be for a 50-year term, renewable once. The licensee must meet specified safety, construction, accessibility, maintenance, etc. standards and must make all reasonable efforts to acquire right-of-way property through private negotiation. DOT can use eminent domain powers under certain circumstances if needed, but all costs must be paid by licensee. Directs DOT to focus on alleviating commuter traffic congestion in selecting the pilot project. DOT must study feasibility of state-owned and operated toll roads and report its findings to the Assembly by 2/1/01. Conference Report passed the Senate by 27-5 and was adopted by the House by 65-31. Ratified 7/13/00 and signed by the Governor.

Effectiveness Rankings

Statistical results of the Center's legislator effectiveness survey are located in Appendix A. The N.C. Center for Public Policy Research conducted its biennial legislative survey during the fall of 1999, after adjournment of the regular long session. All state Senators, Representatives, legislative liaisons and registered lobbyists based in North Carolina, and capital news correspondents were asked to rate the effectiveness of each member of the North Carolina General Assembly on a scale of 1 to 10. Senators were asked to rate only other Senators, and Representatives rated only fellow Representatives.

Eighty-four of the House members (70%) responded to the Center's survey, as did 37 of the 50 Senators (74%), 142 of 328 legis-

lative liaisons and registered lobbyists based in North Carolina (43%), and 7 of 28 capital news correspondents (25%). The overall rate of response was 51%.

The survey's purpose was to identify the most effective legislators in the General Assembly. The Center asked respondents to base their ratings on legislators' participation in committee work, their skill at guiding bills through floor debate, their general knowledge and expertise in specific fields, the respect they command from peers, the enthusiasm with which they execute various legislative responsibilities, the political power they hold (either by virtue of office, longevity, or personal attributes), their ability to sway the opinion of fellow legislators, and their aptitude for the overall legislative process. Respondents were asked to use these criteria, as well as their own personal knowledge of the General Assembly and personal perceptions of those who serve there, in replying to the Center's questionnaire. Rankings from previous legislative sessions are included where applicable.

Also, the name of the "most powerful" committees in each chamber and "most influential" lobbyists in the General Assembly, as determined by the survey, appear in Appendix A.

Effectiveness Survey Results

The tabulated results of the Center's 1999 legislative survey appear on the following pages. Senators, Representatives, lobbyists based in North Carolina, legislative liaisons, and capital news correspondents were asked to rate the effectiveness of each member of the General Assembly. Senators were asked to rate only other Senators, and Representatives rated only fellow members of the House. A total of 526 questionnaires were sent and 270 responses were received.

The poll was conducted by the Center during the fall of 1999, after adjournment of the regular session. At that time, 170 incumbent legislators, 328 registered lobbyists (including some state agency legislative liaisons), and 28 state capital news correspondents were asked to rate on a scale of 1 to 10 the effectiveness of the individual members of each chamber. Respondents also were asked to indicate, in order of priority, the "most powerful" committees in each chamber, and the "most influential" lobbyists in the General Assembly.

The survey's purpose was to identify the most effective legislators in the General Assembly. Respondents were asked to base their ratings on legislators' participation in committee work, their skill at guiding bills through floor debate, their general knowledge and expertise in special fields, the respect they command from peers, the enthusiasm with which they execute various legislative responsibilities, the political power they hold (by virtue of office, longevity, or personal attributes), their ability to sway the opinions of fellow legislators, and their aptitude for the overall legislative process. Respondents were asked to use these criteria, as well as their own personal knowledge of the General Assembly and personal perceptions of those who serve there, in replying to the Center's questionnaire. An exact statistical tabulation of the survey, by respondent group, appears on the following pages.
