Article II of the N.C. Constitution

Section 1. Legislative Power

The legislative power of the State shall be vested in the General Assembly, which shall consist of a Senate and a House of Representatives.

Section 2. Number of Senators

The Senate shall be composed of 50 Senators, biennially chosen by ballot.

Section 4. Number of Representatives

The House of Representatives shall be composed of 120 Representatives, biennially chosen by ballot.

Section 24(4). General Laws

The General Assembly may enact general laws regulating the matters set out in this Section.

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About The Center

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To The Reader

An informed electorate is the essence of democratic government, but more than a general understanding of important issues is required if government is to fully serve the public's interests. Informed citizens must also know something about the men and women elected to serve them as legislators. This book has been prepared to acquaint the people of North Carolina with their state senators and representatives.

The fifteenth edition of *Article II* provides concise, yet comprehensive, information about each member of the 2005–2006 North Carolina General Assembly. The first edition covered the 1977–78 legislature. Each senator and representative has been individually profiled in a manner that will quickly tell the reader:

- how to contact each legislator by mail, phone, fax, or e-mail;
- the legislator's occupation and educational background;
- what kind of bills the legislator introduced in 2003–2004, and his
 or her success in getting them passed; and
- how he or she voted on a range of issues of statewide interest during the past two sessions.

In addition, members of the General Assembly who served in the 2003–2004 session and other sessions since 1983 were ranked according to the results of a survey of the "effectiveness" of each senator and representative. Rankings also are included of each legislator's attendance and roll call voting participation.

All of this information has been organized so it can be readily understood and interpreted, and so legislative activities of various incumbents can be easily compared. Sources used in the preparation of Article II include: (1) The North Carolina Manual, prepared by the Office of the Secretary of State; (2) the North Carolina General Assembly Senate and House Rules Directories; (3) North Carolina Legislation 2003 and North Carolina Legislation 2004, published by the UNC-CH School of Government; (4) Summaries of Substantive Ratified Legislation 2003 and Summaries of Substantive Ratified Legislation 2004, published by the Research Division of the N.C. General Assembly; (5) Center surveys of first-term legislators; (6) official roll call vote sheets kept in the legislative library; (7) lists of bills by introducer available at http://www.ncleg.net; and (8) various other legislative listings produced by the principal clerks for the House and Senate and by the staff of the North Carolina General Assembly and also available at http://www.ncleg.net.

Every effort has been made to verify sources and to rectify apparent discrepancies. Each legislator was given the opportunity to review his or her profile page in draft form for accuracy. We publish this book solely for the purpose of making information about state legislators more accessible, and thus more meaningful, to the people of North Carolina.

How To Use This Book

Profiles of the members of the North Carolina General Assembly are ordered alphabetically within the sections designated Senate and House of Representatives. The legislator's party affiliation, district, county of residence, date of birth, counties in district, addresses, and telephone numbers are listed below his or her name. Terms served are noted to the right, with any terms served in the other chamber listed in parentheses. Additional information explaining portions of the profile data is detailed below under headings keyed to the profiles themselves.

- If you desire information about a particular legislator, simply turn to the page on which his or her profile is placed in alphabetical order within the Senate or the House.
- If you desire information about legislators representing a particular Senate or House district, use the index by district which appears at the beginning of the section for each chamber and then locate the legislator's profile according to alphabetical order.
- If you desire information about legislators who represent various regions of the state, use the map which appears at the beginning of the section for each chamber to determine which districts are in that region. Use the index by district to identify the legislators representing those districts, and then locate each legislator's profile in alphabetical order.

Selected Bills Introduced 2003-2004

For re-elected members, the number and the abbreviated title or subject matter of five bills introduced by the legislator during the 2003–2004 term appear in this section. Bills listed are usually *public* bills (statewide rather than local) for which the legislator was the *principal* sponsor. In selecting a legislator's five bills, the Center showed a preference for ratified bills and those dealing with subjects which related to committees on which the legislator served or which he or she chaired. If the legislator introduced fewer than five public bills, local bills may also be listed.

The "Action" indicated is the final disposition of the bill as of the end of the 2003–2004 session. All bills and resolutions not ratified automatically expire at the conclusion of each biennial term of the General Assembly. The following abbreviations are used in the "Action" column:

The final action taken on each bill is compiled and published by the General Assembly, and that is the information used by the Center to compile this section. Previously, the Assembly included a notation (RPAB) when a bill was ratified as part of another bill, which occurred most frequently when small appropriations bills were ratified as part of the larger state budget bill. Since that information is no longer being recorded by the legislature, it is available only when a legislator notifies the Center. Also, it is not unusual for identical bills to be introduced in both chambers. In such situations, only one of these bills can be ratified. If one of them is ratified, the companion identical bill is not reported as ratified. These factors may artificially lower the number of bills on which a legislator was actually successful.

Where He/She Stands 2003-2004

Twelve bills which generated statewide attention during the 2003–2004 sessions are listed on each legislator's profile, along with an indication of the vote on the measure in the appropriate chamber and the vote cast by the legislator, if he or she was a member at the time the vote was taken.

- S 2, Tax Incentives for Dell/Computer Manufacturers: The act creates a new tax credit for large computer manufacturers that can be taken against the corporate income or franchise tax. To get this credit, the manufacturer must open a new plant using at least \$100 million in private funds and create at least 1,200 new, full-time jobs within five years. If the manufacturer meets those criteria and other requirements set out in the legislation, it becomes eligible for a tax credit of up to \$10 million per year for 2005-2009, \$15 million per year for 2010-2014, \$20 million per year for 2015-2019, and a maximum total amount of \$225 million. If the company fails to create at least 1,200 new, permanent, full-time jobs within five years of the beginning of construction, no further tax credits may be taken. However, failure to create the required jobs by the end of the five years does not result in the forfeiture of previously taken credits. The new law removes geographic restrictions for computer manufacturers on some tax credits previously available only to manufacturers locating in economically distressed areas. The General Assembly also authorized refunds of sales taxes paid by owners of a computer manufacturer in relation to the construction of the facility. The Senate passed Senate Bill 2 on second reading on 11/4/2004 by a vote of 33-15, and the House approved the Senate measure on second reading on 11/4/2004 by a vote of 93-18. Ratified 11/4/2004 and signed by the Governor (Session Law 2004-204 Extra Session).
- S 6, S: Ban Video Poker/H: Strengthen Regulation: The Senate version of this bill would have banned possession and operation of video gaming machines, except by federally recognized Indian tribes or for assembly, repair, manufacture, warehousing, and transport for sale in other states. The House version of this bill would not have banned video poker but strengthened regulation instead. It would have allowed warehousing of video gaming machines in North Carolina, preempted any local government from adopting more restrictive ordinances regulating video gaming devices, transferred responsibility for handling registration of the devices from county sheriffs to the state Alcohol Law Enforcement Division (ALE), specified what must be included in the registration, required all machines to have serial numbers permanently affixed to the machine, and prohibited the use of words "jackpot," "casino," or "Las Vegas" on the device or in sound systems in the devices. The bill would have required specified machines to be equipped with a hand count feature that permits reconciliation of numbers of plays and number of paper coupons issued. Would have added a new annual registration fee of \$300 per machine to

support the video gaming machine enforcement and registration program and would have established an excise tax of \$5,000 per machine for illegal machines. As of December 31, 2002, there were 9,025 video gaming machines in service at 4,063 locations. The Senate passed Senate Bill 6 on second reading on 4/22/2003 by a vote of 48–1, and the House approved a committee substitute which had been reported out without prejudice on third reading on 7/14/2004 by a vote of 59–52. The Senate did not concur in the House changes.

- S 583, Ban Tobacco Products in Public Schools: Directs local boards of education to adopt and enforce written policies for enforcement of the federal prohibition on smoking in any school building used to provide routine or regular kindergarten, elementary, or secondary education, or library services to children. The policies adopted by local school boards must prohibit the use of all tobacco products in enclosed school buildings during school hours, and include: (1) adequate notice to students and personnel about the policy, (2) signs regarding the use of tobacco products by any person, and (3) enforcement by school personnel. Local boards are allowed to adopt and enforce more restrictive policies on tobacco use in school buildings and school facilities, on school campuses, at school-related events, and on other school property than are required by this law. The Senate passed Senate Bill 583 on second reading on 4/29/2003 by a vote of 39-11, and the House approved the measure on third reading on 7/9/2003 by a vote of 76-38. Ratified 7/6/2003 and signed by the Governor (Session Law 2003-421).
- S 725, Amend Constitution for Tax Increment Financing: Submitted a constitutional amendment to the voters of the state to allow the General Assembly to authorize counties and cities to borrow money, without voter approval, to finance the public portion of certain economic development projects within defined territorial areas. This economic development tool, generally known as "tax increment financing" but referred to as "project development financing" in this act, allows local governments to set aside the additional property taxes that are generated by a new investment to pay for public facilities that support that new investment. The land area of the tax increment financing district cannot exceed 5 percent of the land area of the local jurisdiction - county or city - issuing the tax increment financing. The Local Government Commission in the N.C. Department of the State Treasurer must approve the districts and plans. Bond proceeds may be used to finance parking facilities, sewer systems, solid waste disposal systems, storm sewers, flood control, water systems, street improvements, public transportation facilities, land development, and redevelopment. A similar bill and constitutional amendment had been rejected by North Carolina voters twice before. On July 29, 1982, voters defeated the amendment on a vote of 182,147 (18.3 percent) in favor to 810,565 (81.7 percent) against. On November 2, 1993, the amendment again was defeated by a vote of 176,762 (21.3 percent) in favor to 651,190 (78.7 percent) against. The House passed Senate Bill

- 725 on third reading on 7/18/2003 by a vote of 86–23, and the Senate concurred with the same bill on second reading on 7/19/2003 by a vote of 42–2. Ratified 7/19/2003 and signed by the Governor (Session Law 2003-403). Submitted to the voters on November 2, 2004 and approved by a vote of 1,504,391 (51.3 percent) to 1,429,179 (48.7 percent).
- S 919, No Firearm If Domestic Violence Order: Requires that courts order defendants under a domestic violence restraining order to surrender to the sheriff all firearms, machine guns, ammunition, permits to purchase firearms, and permits to carry concealed firearms that are in the defendant's care, custody, possession, ownership, or control if the court finds: (1) the use or threatened use of a deadly weapon by the defendant or a pattern of prior conduct by the defendant involving violence with a firearm against persons, or (2) threats to seriously injure or kill the aggrieved party or minor child by the defendant, or (3) threats to commit suicide by the defendant, or (4) serious injuries inflicted upon the aggrieved party or minor child by the defendant. Makes it a felony to violate the court order; to fail to surrender the firearms, ammunition or permits; or to provide false information to the court. The House passed Senate Bill 919 on third reading on 6/24/2003 by a vote of 116-1, and the Senate concurred and approved the measure on third reading on 7/9/2003 by a vote of 44-3. Ratified 7/10/2003 and signed by the Governor (Session Law 2003-410).
- S 972, 2-Year Moratorium on Death Penalty: Would have provided for a 2-year moratorium on executions of any person sentenced to death under state law. Would have required a study examining the imposition of a death sentence under North Carolina law, which would have evaluated: (1) the adequacy of counsel in all stages of capital cases, and the sufficiency of guidelines for the appointment and performance of such counsel; (2) the process for judicial review of the merits of constitutional claims in state post-conviction and federal habeas corpus proceedings; (3) any disproportionate racial impact from any aspect of capital case processing; (4) whether there is discrimination in capital sentencing on the basis of the victim's or the defendant's race; (5) prosecutorial misconduct as a factor in the imposition of the death penalty; (6) the presence of innocent persons on death row; and (7) any other appropriate or relevant subject. The Senate passed Senate Bill 972 on second reading on 4/30/2003 by a vote of 29-21. The House never voted on the bill.
- H 3, Legislative Redistricting Plan: Sets forth new boundaries for districts for election to the North Carolina General Assembly. Divides the state into 50 Senate districts which elect one state senator each. Also divides the state into 120 House districts that elect one state representative each. The legislation was effective for the 2004 election and subject to pre-clearance by the U.S. Department of Justice for compliance with the federal Voting Rights Act. The legislation made provisions for delaying primary elections if necessary and required that primaries for other state offices be held on the same day as legislative primaries. Requires that legal challenges to legislative districts be filed

in Wake County and heard by a three-judge panel containing no former members of the General Assembly. Requires state courts to specify facts leading to any decision to overturn redistricting schemes. Forbids the judicial branch from imposing a redistricting remedy without first giving the General Assembly an opportunity to remedy defects in the redistricting plan. The Senate passed House Bill 3 on second reading on 11/25/2003 by a vote of 25–23, and the House concurred with the Senate on 11/25/2003 by a vote of 72–44. Ratified 11/25/2003 and signed by the Governor (Session Law 2003-434 Extra Session).

- H 31, Raise Cap on Number of Charter Schools: This bill would have raised the statewide cap on the number of charter schools allowed from 100 to 110. The first charter schools in North Carolina opened in 1997, and the number of schools grew rapidly to fill the 100 slots authorized by the state. Charter schools are nonprofit corporations run by volunteer boards of directors that have significant autonomy in determining how the schools are operated, yet they are hybrids in that they rely primarily on state funds. As nonprofits, they receive freedom from many government regulations and are free to raise money from foundations, corporations, and individuals. Their governing boards are not subject to local boards of education, and they are free to pursue the best teachers, who may be attracted by small class size, small schools, and the opportunity to have a greater say in operations. Yet charter schools are public schools in that anyone is eligible to attend, the schools do not charge tuition, and they are guaranteed a certain level of state and local funds. The idea behind charter schools is that freedom from various rules and regulations will create room for innovation and transmit fresh ideas and enthusiasm to public schools. There were six goals laid out for charter schools in the original enabling legislation: (1) giving teachers expanded professional opportunities, (2) being held accountable on performance-based tests, (3) providing parents expanded choice for their children's education, (4) improving student learning, (5) increasing learning opportunities for all students, with a special emphasis on at-risk or gifted students, and (6) providing innovative teaching that can be adapted to the traditional public schools. (For an evaluation of the charter school experiment, see the July 2002 issue of the Center's North Carolina Insight magazine.) The House passed House Bill 31 on second reading on 4/24/2003 by a vote of 84-23. The full Senate never voted on the bill.

— H 48, Governor's Moving Ahead Transportation Plan: Allows the N.C. Department of Transportation to use \$300 million in Fiscal Year 2003–2004 and \$400 million in Fiscal Year 2004–2005 from the state Highway Trust Fund for highway system preservation, modernization, maintenance, and public transportation. This \$700 million is slated to improve 800 roads and bridges. The plan assigns \$630 million to improve and widen roads. In suburban areas, the state will add turn lanes and pave shoulders to make roads safer. In rural regions, the state will pave dirt roads and widen lanes. The plan also directs \$70 million to public transportation, including a commuter rail

line from Raleigh to Durham and light rail in the Charlotte metropolitan area. The act also requires project selection to be based on identified and documented need. Requires the Department to certify that money spent for this plan will not delay other Highway Trust Fund projects. The act also creates a Blue Ribbon Commission to study mobility needs of urban areas in North Carolina. Funds transferred from the Highway Trust Fund to the General Fund must be repaid to the Highway Trust Fund within five years. The House adopted the conference report on House Bill 48 on 7/20/2003 by a vote of 85–4, and the Senate adopted the conference report on 7/20/2003 by a vote of 35–3. Ratified 7/20/2003 and signed by the Governor (Session Law 2003-383).

— H 397, 2003–2005 State Budget: Appropriates \$14.8 billion annually to operate state government for Fiscal Years 2003-2004 through 2004-2005. Extends the sunset on legislation that had increased the state sales tax from 4 percent to 4.5 percent from 7/1/2003 until 7/1/2005 and extends the sunset on expiration of the 8.25 percent top rate for individual income taxpayers through the 2005 tax year. Makes changes to the N.C. sales and use taxes to conform to the multistate Streamlined Sales and Use Tax Agreement and mandates increased tax collection efforts by the N.C. Department of Revenue. Provides a 1.8 percent average salary increase for teachers; a \$550 onetime bonus for most state employees in lieu of a salary increase; a onetime annual leave bonus of 10 days for most state employees; a 1.28 percent cost of living increase for retirees in the Teachers' and State Employees', Judicial, and Legislative Retirement Systems; and decreases the student to teacher ratio in second grade classes from 1:20 to 1:18. Appropriates \$43.1 million for Governor Mike Easley's More At Four program for at-risk four-year-olds, \$62 million to the Clean Water Management Trust Fund, and \$150 million to the state's Savings Reserve Account. Authorizes up to \$300 million for repair and renovation of state properties through the use of special indebtedness. Mandates three separate studies related to budget procedures and the appropriations process. The House adopted the conference report for House Bill 397 on second reading on 6/29/2003 by a vote of 77-39, and the Senate adopted the conference report on third reading on 6/30/ 2003 by a vote of 25-19. Ratified on 6/30/2003 and signed by the Governor (Session Law 2003-284).

— H 429, Compensation for Billboard Removal: Allows counties and cities to regulate the use of billboards within their jurisdiction or to require removal if the signs do not conform to local ordinances. However, if a local government amends or enacts an ordinance that requires the removal of a billboard, the city or county must pay monetary compensation to the owner for the sign. The legislation sets out procedures for removing signs and paying sign owners, sets parameters for defining the amount of compensation to be given to sign owners, and provides guidelines for settling disputes arising from removal of signs. The legislation provides exceptions to the compensation

requirement for signs detrimental to public health or safety or which have been deemed public nuisances, and for signs that must be removed for road widening or other governmental development, provided the county or city allows the sign to be moved to a comparable location. The legislation also repeals a moratorium on the enactment of new or expanded local ordinances amortizing billboards. The House passed House Bill 429 on third reading on 4/10/2003 by a vote of 93–18, and the Senate passed a committee substitute of the House bill on 6/24/2004 by a vote of 34–11. The Governor vetoed the legislation on 7/9/2004, but the House overrode the veto, 79–34, on 7/12/2004. The Senate then included most of the provisions of vetoed bill H 429 into a different bill (originally an unrelated bill to regulate deferred deposits), House Bill 1213, which then passed the Senate, was concurred with in the House, was ratified on 7/17/2004, and signed by the Governor (Session Law 2004-152).

- H 1264, Finance University Research & Health Buildings: Authorizes the state to use special indebtedness to finance 11 university projects across 12 campuses of the University of North Carolina system, including: a \$180 million cancer center at UNC Hospitals in Chapel Hill, a \$60 million heart center for East Carolina University in Greenville, a \$35 million bioinformatics center at the University of North Carolina at Charlotte, and a \$28 million facility to house a new pharmacy school to be located at Elizabeth City State University. Authorizes the state to enter into up to \$45 million of special indebtedness to finance capital projects for the state parks system; parks, recreation, and the preservation of natural heritage; and clean water conservation. However, limits the amount of debt that may be incurred for these latter three purposes to the amount of debt service that can be supported by the Parks and Recreation Trust Fund, the Natural Heritage Trust Fund, and the Clean Water Management Trust Fund. Authorizes the state to use up to \$35 million in special indebtedness for the Department of Correction to finance the construction of up to five new Youth Development Centers totaling up to 224 beds. Provides that a portion of the Master Tobacco Settlement funds available to the Health and Wellness Trust Fund and the Tobacco Trust Fund would be used to reimburse the General Fund each year for debt service on the UNC and youth prison debt. The required transfer from each trust fund is capped, however, at a percentage of current year receipts. Creates a Debt Affordability Advisory Committee to undertake an annual debt affordability study and establish guidelines for evaluating the state's debt burden and annually advise the Governor and the General Assembly on the estimated debt capacity of the state for the next 10 fiscal years. Directs the UNC Board of Governors, in collaboration with the State Board of Community Colleges, to contract with a consultant to conduct a comprehensive study of the mission and programming needs for the UNC System and the Community Colleges System, and to study facility needs related to the identified program needs and specifically states that the historically black colleges and

universities and UNC-Pembroke are valuable and indispensable assets of the UNC system and should not be diminished or eliminated. Establishes the statutory framework for Real Estate Certificates of Participation (RECOP) indebtedness. RECOP financing is a form of special indebtedness that is intended to be structured so that the principal and some of the interest are not paid in installments over the term of the debt. The deferred interest compounds and is payable, along with the principal, at maturity or an earlier redemption. RECOP debt may be incurred only if the amount and specific purposes have been authorized in an act of the General Assembly. The House adopted the conference report for House Bill 1264 on third reading on 7/17/2004 by a vote of 87-24, and the Senate adopted the conference report on third reading on 7/17/2004 by a vote of 36-6. Ratified on 7/17/2004 and signed by the Governor (Session Law 2004-179).

Effectiveness Rankings

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Statistical results of the Center's legislator effectiveness survey are located in Appendix A. The N.C. Center for Public Policy Research conducted its legislative survey during January, February, and March of 2004. All state Senators and Representatives, registered lobbyists, and state capital news correspondents were asked to rate the "effectiveness" of each member of the North Carolina General Assembly on a scale of one to 10. Senators were asked to rank only other Senators, and Representatives rated only their fellow Representatives.

Ninety-two of the 119 (one Representative died after adjournment) House members (77%) responded to the Center's survey, as did 37 of the 50 Senators (74%), 145 of the 366 lead legislative liaisons and lobbyists based in North Carolina (40%), and 8 of 21 capital news correspondents (54%). The overall response rate was 51%.

The survey's purpose was to identify the most effective legislators in the General Assembly. The Center asked respondents to base their ratings on legislators' participation in committee work, their skill at guiding bills through committee and floor debate, their general knowledge and expertise in special fields, the respect they command from peers, the enthusiasm with which they execute various legislative responsibilities, the political power they hold (by virtue of office, longevity, or personal skills), their ability to sway the opinions of fellow legislators, and their aptitude for the overall legislative process. Respondents were asked to use these criteria, as well as their own personal knowledge of the General Assembly and personal perceptions of those who serve there, in replying to the Center's questionnaire. Rankings from previous legislative sessions are included where applicable.

Also, the name of the "most powerful" committees in each chamber and "most influential" lobbyists in the General Assembly, as determined by the survey, appear in Appendix A.

Rankings of Legislative Session Attendance and Roll Call Voting Participation

In 2004, using official records from the General Assembly, the Center compiled attendance and roll call voting participation rankings. The attendance ranking of legislators is based on the percentage of legislative days present. A lower ranking number indicates higher attendance, while a higher ranking indicates lower attendance. The voting participation ranking of legislators is based on their percentage of voting participation for legislative floor votes. A lower ranking number indicates a higher voting percentage while a higher ranking indicates a lower voting percentage. A summary of these two rankings appear in Appendix A.

Effectiveness Survey Results

The tabulated results of the Center's 2003 legislative survey appear on the following pages. Senators, Representatives, lobbyists based in North Carolina, lead legislative liaisons, and capital news correspondents were asked to rate the effectiveness of each member of the General Assembly. Senators were asked to rate only other Senators, and Representatives rated only fellow members of the House. A total of 556 questionnaires were sent and 282 responses were received, for an overall response rate of 51%.

The poll was conducted by the Center during January, February, and March of 2004. At that time, 169 (one Representative died after adjournment) incumbent legislators, 366 registered lobbyists (including the lead state agency legislative liaisons), and 21 state capital news correspondents were asked to rate on a scale of one to 10 the effectiveness of the individual members of each chamber. Respondents also were asked to indicate, in order of priority, the "most powerful" committees in each chamber, and the "most influential" lobbyists in the General Assembly.

The survey's purpose was to identify the most effective legislators in the General Assembly. The Center asked respondents to base their ratings on legislators' participation in committee work, their skill at guiding bills through committee and floor debate, their general knowledge and expertise in special fields, the respect they command from peers, the enthusiasm with which they execute various legislative responsibilities, the political power they hold (by virtue of office, longevity, or personal skills), their ability to sway the opinions of fellow legislators, and their aptitude for the overall legislative process. Respondents were asked to use these criteria, as well as their own personal knowledge of the General Assembly and personal perceptions of those who serve there, in replying to the Center's questionnaire. An exact statistical tabulation of the survey appears on the following pages.
