

# ARTICLE II

## **Section 1. Legislative power.**

The legislative power of the State shall be vested in the General Assembly, which shall consist of a Senate and a House of Representatives.

## **Sec. 2. Number of Senators**

The Senate shall be composed of 50 Senators, biennially chosen by ballot.

## **Sec. 4. Number of Representatives**

The House of Representatives shall be composed of 120 Representatives, biennially chosen by ballot.

## **Sec. 24 (4) General Laws**

The General Assembly may enact general laws regulating the matters set out in this Section.

# The North Carolina Center

---

The North Carolina Center is an independent research and educational institution formed to study state government policies and practices without partisan bias or political intent. Its purpose is to enrich the dialogue between private citizens and public officials, and its constituency is the people of this state. The Center's broad institutional goal is the stimulation of greater interest in public affairs and a better understanding of the profound impact state government has each day on everyone in North Carolina.

A non-profit, non-partisan organization, the Center was formed in 1977 by a diverse group of private citizens "for the purposes of gathering, analyzing and disseminating information concerning North Carolina's institutions of government." It is guided by a self-electing Board of Directors, and has some 600 individual and corporate members across the state. The Center's staff of associate directors, fellows, and interns includes various scholars, students, journalists, and professionals. Several advisory boards provide members of the staff with expert guidance in specific fields such as education, publications, and fund raising. The Center is forbidden by law from lobbying or otherwise attempting to influence directly the passage of legislation.

Center projects include the issuance of special reports on major policy questions; the publication of a periodic magazine called *N.C. Insight*; the production of forums, seminars, and television documentaries; the maintenance of a speakers bureau; and the regular participation of members of the staff and the board in public affairs programs around the state. An attempt is made in the various projects undertaken by the Center to synthesize the integrity of scholarly research with the readability of good journalism. Each Center publication represents an effort to amplify conflicting views on the subject under study and to reach conclusions based on a sound rationalization of these competing ideas. Whenever possible, Center publications advance recommendations for changes in government policies and practices that would seem, based on our research, to hold promise for the improvement of government service to the people of North Carolina.

# To the reader:

---

An informed electorate is the essence of democratic government, but more than a general understanding of important issues is required if government is to serve the public's interests. Informed citizens must also know something about the men and women elected to serve them as legislators. It is to acquaint the people of North Carolina with their state senators and representatives that this book has been prepared.

This second edition of *Article II* provides a concise yet comprehensive impression of each member of the 1979-80 North Carolina General Assembly. (The first edition covered the 1977-78 legislature.) Each senator and representative has been individually profiled in a manner that will quickly tell the reader:

- Who the legislator is, and how he or she can be reached;
- What his or her education or occupation is;
- How he or she got to the legislature;
- What committees he or she serves on;
- What kinds of bills he or she introduced in 1979; and,
- How he or she voted on a range of issues of wide state interest during the past session.

In addition, members of the General Assembly who served in the 1979 session have been rated according to the results of a survey of the "effectiveness" of each senator and representative conducted by the Center during the summer of 1979, just after adjournment. At that time, 170 incumbent legislators, 324 registered lobbyists, and 33 experienced state reporters were asked to rate on a scale of 1 to 10 the "effectiveness" of the individual members of each chamber. Respondents were also asked to indicate, in order of priority, the ten most "influential" legislators, and the ten most "powerful" committees in the General Assembly.

The purpose of the survey was to identify, in a general way, those North Carolina legislators who make the most significant contributions to the General Assembly by their participation in committee work, their skill at guiding bills through floor debate, their general knowledge and their expertise in special fields, the respect they command from peers, the enthusiasm with which they execute various legislative responsibilities, the political power they hold (either by virtue of office, longevity, or personal attributes), their ability to sway the opinions of their fellow legislators, and their aptitude for the overall legislative process. Respondents were asked to use these criteria, as well as their own knowledge of the General Assembly and their personal perceptions of those who serve there, in replying to the Center's questionnaire.

Each legislator's individual profile includes a symbol reflecting his or her "effectiveness" rating based solely on

the results of this survey. A single symbol indicates that the legislator's overall score placed him or her in the lowest quarter of the appropriate chamber. Two symbols indicate a score in the second quarter. Three symbols indicate a score in the third quarter. Four symbols indicate a score in the top quarter. Democrats are identified by symbolic donkeys; Republicans by symbolic elephants. An exact statistical tabulation of the survey results, broken down by respondent groups, appears in the Appendix.

All of this information has been organized so that it can be readily understood and interpreted, and so that the legislative activities of various incumbents can be easily compared. Some information about new members of the General Assembly appointed after the 1979 session has also been included. In most cases, new members have been given the offices and committee assignments of those legislators they were appointed to replace. Sources used in the preparation of *Article II* include: (1) *The North Carolina Manual* and (2) 1978 election results, both prepared by the office of the Secretary of State; (3) the 1979 North Carolina General Assembly Senate and House Rules Directories; (4) *the 1979 State Legislative Building Telephone Directory* prepared by the Legislative Services Office; (5) Southern Bell Telephone Company's *Legislative Directory 1979-1980*; (6) the annual Statement of Economic Interest each legislator is required by law to file; (7) the various campaign finance reports required from each candidate for legislative office during and after primaries and the general election; (8) the various financial reports required by law from political action committees (PACs); (9) the *Daily Bulletin* and associated publications of the Institute of Government of the University of North Carolina; (10) the *Senate Journal* and the *House Journal* for the 1979 session; (11) official roll call votes tabulated by the North Carolina legislature; and (12) the 1970 North Carolina Census. Some legislators were contacted personally to confirm or amplify specific background details.

No criticism of any individual is intended by the Center in the accumulation and presentation of this material. Campaign information has been taken directly from various reports filed by the legislators and their contributors. Representative bills (always public bills unless fewer than four public bills were introduced) have been selected to indicate the range of an individual's interests, without regard to final action taken on the proposed legislation. Every effort has been made to verify sources and to rectify apparent discrepancies. We publish this book solely for the purpose of making information about state legislators more accessible, and thus more meaningful, to the people of North Carolina.



# How to use this book

---

## General Use

Profiles of the members of the North Carolina General Assembly are ordered alphabetically within the sections designated Senate and House of Representatives. Each profile is arranged systematically, and includes specific information under various self-explanatory headings. The legislator's party, district, office number, seat number, and telephone number are listed below his or her name. Terms served in the chamber of which the legislator is a member are noted to the right, with any terms served in the other chamber listed in parentheses. The legislator's symbolic "effectiveness" rating appears immediately above his or her previous terms. Additional information explaining portions of the profile data is detailed below under headings keyed to the profiles themselves.

—If you desire information about a particular legislator, simply turn to the page on which his or her profile is placed in alphabetical sequence.

—If you desire information about legislators representing a particular Senate or House district, use the index by district which appears in each section and then locate the legislator profiles according to alphabetical sequence.

—If you desire information about legislators who represent various regions of the state, use the map which appears at the beginning of each section to determine which districts are in that region. Use the index by district to identify the legislators representing those districts, and then locate each legislator's profile in alphabetical sequence.

Statistical results of the Center's legislative survey appear in the Appendix. It contains the names of each legislator, arranged alphabetically by chamber, followed by the tabulated results of the survey broken down according to responses received from legislators, lobbyists, and news reporters. The overall "effectiveness" score, on which the symbolic rating of each legislator is based, was derived by averaging the results of responses received in a manner which gave equal weight to each respondent group. The overall rating appears in bold type. The names of the ten "most influential" legislators and the ten "most powerful" committees in the General Assembly, as determined by the survey, also appear in the Appendix.

### 1978 Campaign Information

The number of registered voters shown includes those of all parties in the legislator's district. The figure for total votes received reflects the results of the 1978 general election, in which voters of any party might have cast their ballots for the eventual winner. A "U" in parentheses following total votes received indicates the legislator was unopposed in the general election. Campaign contributions and expenditures shown are aggregate amounts reported by the legislator during the primaries and the general election.

### Selected Bills Introduced (1979)

The number and the abbreviated title of four representative bills introduced by the legislator during 1979 appear in this section. Bills listed are public bills unless the legislator introduced fewer than four public bills, in which case local bills are also listed. "Action" indicated is the final disposition of the bill during the 1979 session. (Note: Under the adjournment resolution passed at the end of the 1979 session, pending House bills referred to Senate committees and pending Senate bills referred to House committees may receive further consideration in 1980. A key for interpreting the "Action" column appears below:

### Where He/She Stands . . .

Nine bills which generated statewide attention during 1979 are listed on each legislator's profile, along with an indication of the final substantive vote on the measure in the appropriate chamber and the final substantive vote cast by the legislator:

—HB 183, clarified the state's Open Meetings Law but

---

did not strengthen enforcement provisions to assure public access to meetings held by certain public bodies.

—HB 1182, called for a constitutional amendment to require that all state justices and judges be lawyers and provided for a statewide referendum on the amendment to be held in November, 1980.

—SB 171, defined domestic violence, including the crime of domestic criminal trespass, provided specific legal remedies, and expanded enforcement powers to deal with such crimes.

—SB 266, established the State Board of Community Colleges and Technical Institutes and provided for the creation of an administrative department to govern it.

—SB 383, exempted church schools from state education laws except those pertaining to attendance and immunization records, fire, health and safety, nine-month terms, and standardized testing.

—SB 389, committed the state to provide better social and health care services for families, especially children, and established the New Generation Interagency Committee to coordinate such services.

—SB 526, exempted "qualified nonpublic schools" from state education laws in the same way SB 383 exempted "church schools and schools with religious charters."

—SB 560, classified criminal offenses in North Carolina and provided for a standardized "presumptive" sentencing system.

—SB 614, permitted the conversion of mutually-owned savings and loan associations to stock-owned associations.

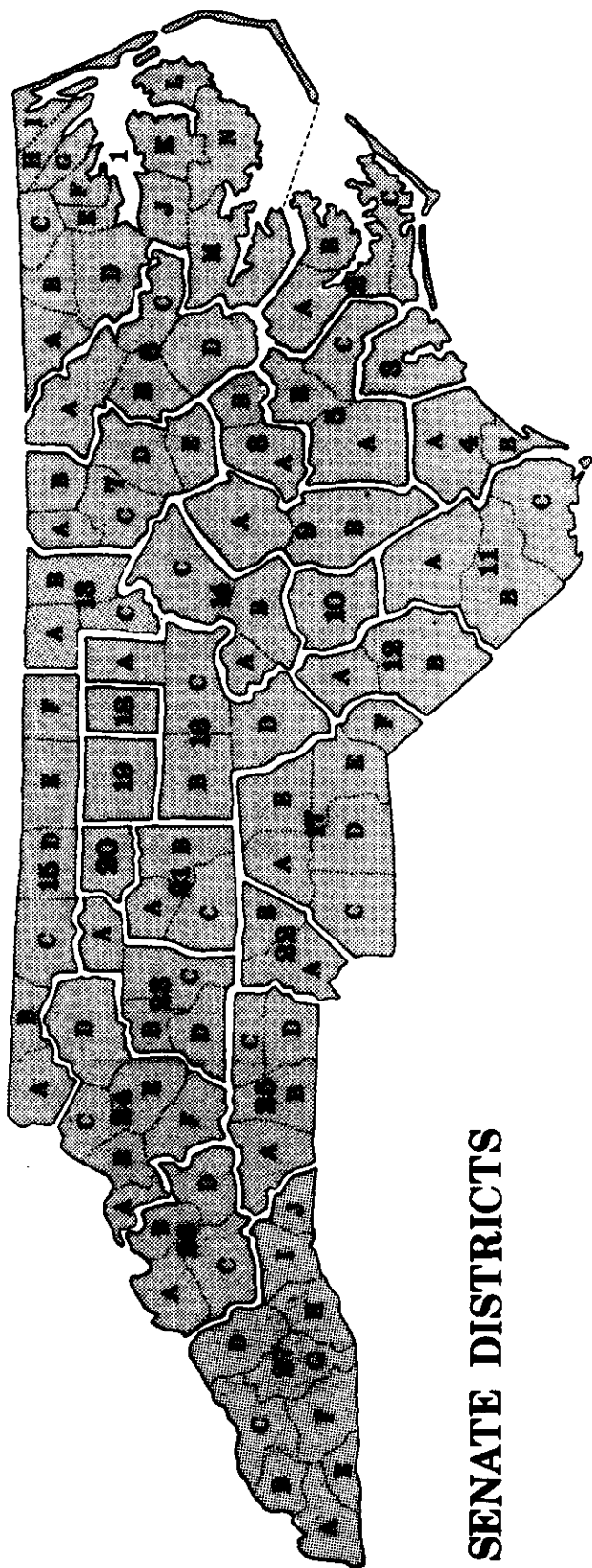

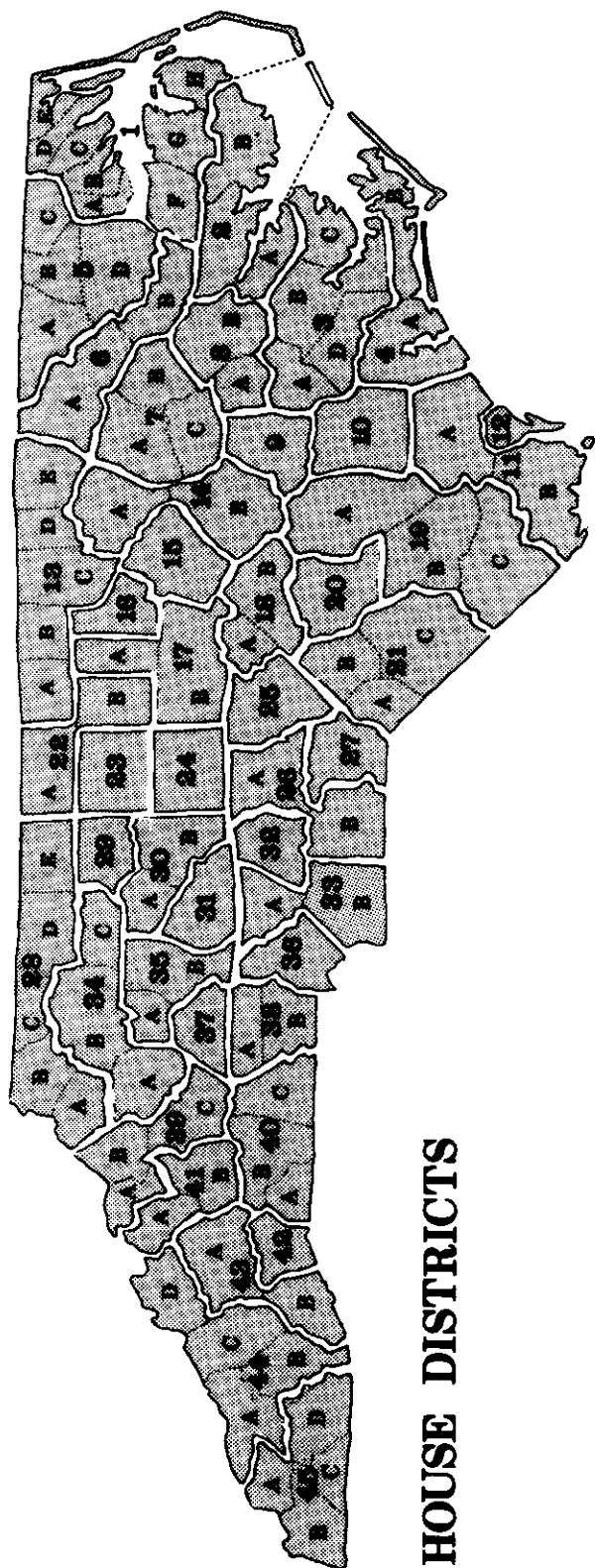

Tabulated results of the Center's legislative survey appear on the following pages. Senators, Representatives, lobbyists, and capital correspondents were asked to rate the "effectiveness" of each member of the General Assembly except new appointees. (Senators were not asked to rate Representatives, nor were Representatives asked to rate Senators.) 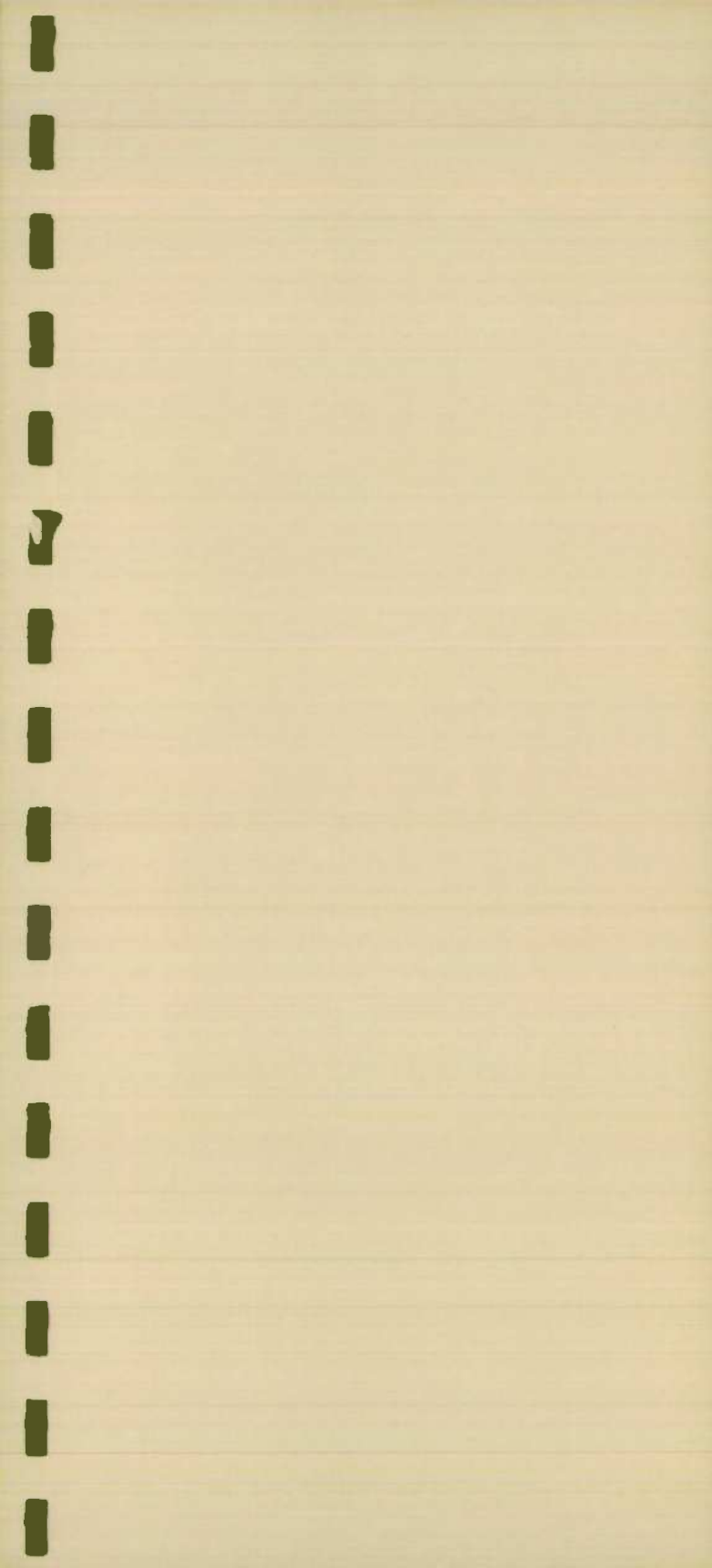
