To The Reader

An informed electorate is the essence of democratic government, but more than a general understanding of important issues is required if government is to fully serve the public's interests. Informed citizens must also know something about the men and women elected to serve them as legislators. It is to acquaint the people of North Carolina with their state senators and representatives that this book has been prepared.

This seventh edition of Article II provides concise, yet comprehensive, information about each member of the 1989-90 North Carolina General Assembly. (The first edition covered the 1977-78 legislature.) Each senator and representative has been individually profiled in a manner that will quickly tell the reader:

- how to contact each legislator by mail or telephone;
- the legislator's occupation and educational background;
- his or her committee assignments;
- what kinds of bills the legislator introduced in 1987-88, and his or her success in getting them passed; and
- how he or she voted on a range of issues of statewide interest during the past two sessions.

In addition, members of the General Assembly who served in the 1987 session were ranked according to the results of a survey of the "effectiveness" of each senator and representative.

All of this information has been organized so it can be readily understood and interpreted, and so legislative activities of various incumbents can be easily compared. Sources used in the preparation of Article II include: (1) The North Carolina Manual, prepared by the Office of the Secretary of State; (2) the North Carolina General Assembly Senate and House Rules-Directories; (3) Southern Bell Telephone Company's N.C. Legislative Directory; (4) the Daily Bulletin and associated publications of the Institute of Government of the University of North Carolina; (5) the Senate Journal and the House Journal for the 1987 session; and (6) official roll call vote sheets and various legislative listings tabulated by the Principal Clerks for the House and Senate of the North Carolina General Assembly. Each legislator was given the opportunity to review the information in draft form for accuracy.

Representative bills (public bills unless fewer than five public bills were introduced) have been selected to indicate the range of an individual's interests. The choice of bills was made with a preference for ratified (enacted into law) bills.

Every effort has been made to verify sources and to rectify apparent discrepancies. We publish this book solely for the purpose of making information about state legislators more accessible, and thus more meaningful, to the people of North Carolina.

How To Use This Book

General Use

Profiles of the members of the North Carolina General Assembly are ordered alphabetically within the sections designated Senate and House of Representatives. Each profile is arranged systematically and includes specific information under various self-explanatory headings. The legislator's party, county of residence, district, addresses, date of birth, seat number, and telephone numbers are listed below his or her name. Terms served in the chamber of which the legislator is a member are noted to the right, with any terms served in the other chamber listed in parentheses. Additional information explaining portions of the profile data is detailed below under headings keyed to the profiles themselves.

- If you desire information about a particular legislator, simply turn to the page on which his or her profile is placed in alphabetical sequence.
- If you desire information about legislators representing a particular Senate or House district, use the index by district which appears at the beginning of each section and then locate the legislator's profile according to alphabetical sequence.
- If you desire information about legislators who represent various regions of the state, use the map which appears at the beginning of each section to determine which districts are in that region. Use the index by district to identify the legislators representing those districts, and then locate each legislator's profile in alphabetical sequence.

Committees

The committee assignments for each legislator are listed in alphabetical order beginning with chairmanships and vice-chairmanships.

In the Senate, "RMM" indicates the legislator is the ranking minority party member of the committee. The ranking minority member, chairman, and vice-chairman of the Senate Appropriations subcommittees are also members of the full Appropriations Committee.

In the House of Representatives, a subcommittee chairman also serves as vice-chairman of the full committee, and a member of a subcommittee is automatically a member of the full committee. The full committee name is followed by a "/" and the name of the subcommittee. Three committees — Ethics, Pensions and Retirement, and Rules, Appointments and the Calendar — do not have subcommittees.

A complete list of standing Senate and House committees and joint legislative commissions may be found in Appendix A.

Selected Bills Introduced (1987-1988)

For re-elected members, the number and the abbreviated title of five representative bills introduced by the legislator during the 1987-88 term appear in this section. Bills listed are *public* bills for which the legislator was a principal sponsor. If the legislator introduced fewer than five public bills, then local bills are also listed. "Action" indicated is the final disposition of the bill as of the end of the 1988 summer session. Any bill/resolution not ratified automatically expires at the conclusion of each biennial term of the General Assembly. A key for interpreting the "Action" column appears below:

Where He/She Stands (1987-1988)...

Sixteen bills which generated statewide attention during 1987-88 are listed on each legislator's profile, along with an indication of the vote on the measure in the appropriate chamber and the vote cast by the legislator.

- —H 35, Table Withdrawal from Low-Level Waste Compact: To create a N.C. Low-Level Radioactive Waste Management Authority and amend the Southeast Interstate Low-Level Radioactive Waste Management Compact. Senate amendment #2 (Thomas) was tabled 39-10, and House amendment #8 (Nesbitt) was tabled 69-31; both amendments would have withdrawn North Carolina from the Southeast Compact. Ratified 8/14/87.
- —H 39, For Martin Luther King Jr. Holiday: To provide for a paid holiday for state employees honoring Martin Luther King Jr.'s birthday and to change the date for the legal public holiday to the same date provided by federal law (third Monday in January). Second reading (R2) in the Senate passed 38-12, and R2 in the House passed 77-34. Ratified 3/25/87.
- —H 48, To Place Cap on Prison Population: To place a cap of 18,000 on the number of prisoners which may be housed in the state prison system. Also required the N.C. Parole Commission to release enough inmates to meet the target population of 18,000 inmates. Second reading (R2) in the Senate passed 46-0, and R2 in the House passed 106-6. Ratified 3/11/87.

- —H 134, To Clean Up Inactive Hazardous Waste Sites: To authorize the N.C. Department of Human Resources to monitor all inactive hazardous substance or waste disposal sites ("orphan dumps"), and to order persons responsible for such sites to implement cleanup programs. If the responsible party does not implement a remedial program, the Department may do so and demand payment after completion. The bill also established the Clean Drinking Water Fund for the cleanup. Second reading (R2) in the Senate passed 48-1, and R2 passed in the House 97-14. Ratified 7/8/87.
- —H 541, No Death Penalty for Youths Under 17: To prohibit the use of the death penalty as punishment for murder in the first degree if the person who committed murder was under 17 years of age (unless the person committed the murder while serving a prison sentence for a prior murder or while on escape from a sentence for a prior murder). Second reading (R2) in the Senate passed 31-16. Second reading (R2) in the House, when the bill also prohibited use of the death penalty if the person committed murder on his 17th birthday, passed 64-37. The final bill did not include that provision. Ratified 7/29/87.
- —H 1124, Public Financing of Campaigns/Limit Spending: To establish the North Carolina Candidates' Financing Fund in the N.C. Department of the State Treasurer. Taxpayers may contribute a portion or all of their state income tax refund to the Fund. Provides public financing of campaigns for Council of State offices in exchange for candidates agreeing to limit campaign expenditures. Participation in the program by both candidates and taxpayers is voluntary. Second reading (R2) in the Senate passed 41-4, and R2 in the House passed 56-31. Ratified 7/7/88.
- —H 1145, Local Governments to Pay for Billboard Removal: Would have prohibited local governments from removing billboards/outdoor advertising without compensation to the owners of the billboards. Third reading (R3) in the House passed 57-49. No action was taken in the Senate Judiciary I Committee, and the bill died.
- —H 1155, School Building Fund/Inventory, Corporate Tax Changes: To create a public school building capital fund ("critical school facility needs fund") and a commission to determine the critical school facility needs of each county. Also repealed the inventory tax and reimbursed local governments for the resulting revenue loss, increased the corporate income tax from 6% to 7%, and earmarked additional local sales and use tax proceeds for public school construction. Second reading (R2) in the Senate passed 39-8, and R2 in the House passed 77-27. Ratified 7/16/87.
- —H 1211, Limit City Role in Highway Right-of-Way: To limit municipalities' financial participation in improvements to the state highway system. Rural and small-town interests supported a limit to prevent the state's highway funding priorities from favoring large urban areas. Previously, municipalities which provided funds to pay for improvement projects received higher priority in the schedule of major construction projects undertaken by the N.C. Department of Transportation. The bill did grant cities and counties new powers to

protect future highway rights-of-way. Second reading (R2) in the Senate passed 37-1, and R2 in the House passed 89-17. Ratified 8/7/87.

- —H 1240, Limit Consumer Debt Collection in Criminal Courts: To limit the use of the criminal courts for collection of debts by secured creditors and rent-to-own dealers. Also required proof of criminal intent before consumers can be convicted for wrongly disposing of secured property or property obtained in rent-to-own agreements. Third reading (R3) in the Senate passed 46-2, and R3 in the House passed 61-35. Ratified 7/7/87.
- —S 65, For Comparative Fault in Accident Cases: Would have done away with the system of contributory negligence by establishing a comparative fault system in legal actions to compensate for injury or death to persons or harm to property. Under the proposed bill, if the person suing is partially at fault for the injury, his claim would not be barred, but the amount of money he can recover would be reduced in proportion to his own fault. The bill also would have abolished the rule of joint-and-several liability. This provision would have allowed victims to collect all court-awarded damages even if some of the defendants were unable to pay their share of the award. This was the fourth consecutive session in which a comparative fault bill was defeated. Second reading (R2) in the Senate passed 37-12. Second reading (R2) in the House failed 45-68 on 6/10/87.
- —S 113, Tax Credit for Jobs in Distressed Counties: To provide tax credits to corporations (of 9 or more employees) which create new full-time jobs in severely economically distressed counties. A county is considered severely distressed if it has an unemployment rate of seven percent or more, and if it is one of twenty counties with the highest "distress factor," which takes into consideration the county's unemployment rate and per capita income. Third reading (R3) in the Senate passed 43-3, and second reading (R2) in the House passed 58-33. Ratified 7/6/87.
- —S 149, To Make Superintendent of Public Instruction Appointive: To amend the N.C. Constitution (after approval by voters) by changing the Superintendent of Public Instruction from an elected office to one appointed by the State Board of Education. Also would have changed the method of selecting the members of the State Board of Education by decreasing the governor's appointments from 11 to 10, adding four appointments by the General Assembly, and changing the length of members' terms from eight to four years. Second reading (R2) in the Senate passed 42-7 on 4/16/87. No action was taken in the House Constitutional Amendments Committee, and the bill died.
- —S 164, To Ban Phosphate Detergents: To prohibit the manufacture, storage, sale, distribution, or use of cleaning detergents containing phosphorus. Certain exceptions are granted for commercial laundries, health care facilities, laboratories, agriculture and dairy processing facilities, and other user groups. Third reading (R3) in the Senate passed 32-15, and R3 in the House passed 65-45. Ratified 4/29/87.

- —S 172, Increase Workers' Compensation Coverage/Protection: To require employers of 3 (was 4) or more employees to provide workers' compensation coverage, to increase the maximum weekly benefit for injured workers, to decrease the waiting period before receiving compensation, to give better protection to hernia victims, and other additional protections. Second reading (R2) in the Senate passed 46-1, and R2 in the House passed 70-44. Ratified 8/5/87.
- —S 827, Tort Reform To Change Punitive Damage Standard: To raise the standard of proof for the award of punitive damages in civil lawsuits by requiring a victim to prove that a defendant intentionally tried to injure the victim instead of only proving gross negligence, thereby making it more difficult for plaintiffs to collect punitive damages. Second reading (R2) in the Senate failed 15-25 on 5/15/87.

Effectiveness Rating

Statistical results of the Center's legislator effectiveness survey appear in Appendix B. The survey results contain the ranking and name of each legislator — followed by the tabulated results according to the responses received from legislators, lobbyists and legislative liaisons, and capital news correspondents — and the overall score. The overall "effectiveness" score, on which the ranking of each legislator is based, was derived by averaging the results of responses received in a manner which gave equal weight to each respondent group. The overall score based on 100 appears in bold type. The name of the "most powerful" committees in each chamber and "most influential" lobbyists in the General Assembly, as determined by the survey, also appear in Appendix B. Another feature is a comparison of effectiveness rankings in 1987, 1985, 1983, 1981, 1979, and 1977.



Senate Seating Chart



# **Effectiveness Survey Results**

Tabulated results of the Center's 1987 legislative survey appear on the following pages. Senators, Representatives, lobbyists, and capital news correspondents were asked to rate the "effectiveness" of each member of the General Assembly. (Senators were not asked to rate Representatives, nor were Representatives asked to rate Senators.) In addition, respondents were asked to indicate in order of priority their selections for the "most powerful" committees in each chamber, and the "most influential" lobbyists. A total of 474 questionnaires were sent and 271 responses were received.

The poll was conducted by the Center during the fall of 1987, after adjournment of the regular session. At that time, 170 incumbent legislators, 258 registered lobbyists (including some state agency legislative liaisons), and 46 state capital news correspondents were asked to rate on a scale of 1 to 10 the "effectiveness" of the individual members of each chamber. Respondents were also asked to indicate, in order of priority, the "most powerful" committees, and the "most influential" lobbyists in the General Assembly.

The survey's purpose was to identify the most effective legislators in the General Assembly. Ratings were to be based on their participation in committee work, their skill at guiding bills through floor debate, their general knowledge and expertise in special fields, the respect they command from peers, the enthusiasm with which they execute various legislative responsibilities, the political power they hold (either by virtue of office, longevity, or personal attributes), their ability to sway the opinion of fellow legislators, and their aptitude for the overall legislative process. Respondents were asked to use these criteria, as well as their own personal knowledge of the General Assembly and personal perceptions of those who serve there, in replying to the Center's questionnaire. An exact statistical tabulation of the survey results, by respondent group, appears on the following pages.
