#### To The Reader

An informed electorate is the essence of democratic government, but more than a general understanding of important issues is required if government is to fully serve the public's interests. Informed citizens must also know something about the men and women elected to serve them as legislators. This book has been prepared to acquaint the people of North Carolina with their state senators and representatives.

The tenth edition of Article II provides concise, yet comprehensive, information about each member of the 1995–96 North Carolina General Assembly. The first edition covered the 1977–78 legislature. Each senator and representative has been individually profiled in a manner that will quickly tell the reader:

- how to contact each legislator by mail or telephone;
- the legislator's occupation and educational background;
- what kind of bills the legislator introduced in 1993-94, and his or her success in getting them passed; and
- how he or she voted on a range of issues of statewide interest during the past two sessions.

In addition, members of the General Assembly who served in the 1993 session and other sessions since 1977 were ranked according to the results of a survey of the "effectiveness" of each senator and representative.

All of this information has been organized so it can be readily understood and interpreted, and so legislative activities of various incumbents can be easily compared. Sources used in the preparation of Article II include: (1) The North Carolina Manual, prepared by the Office of the Secretary of State; (2) the North Carolina General Assembly Senate and House Rules Directories; (3) Southern Bell Telephone Company's N.C. Legislative Directory; (4) the Daily Bulletin and associated publications of the Institute of Government of the University of North Carolina; (5) the Senate Journal and the House Journal for the 1993–94 session; (6) the North Carolina General Assembly Research Division's Summaries of Substantive Ratified Legislation; and (7) official role call vote sheets and various legislative listings tabulated by the Principal Clerks for the House and Senate of the North Carolina General Assembly. Each legislator was given the opportunity to review the information in draft form for accuracy.

Representative bills (public bills unless fewer than five public bills were introduced) have been selected to indicate the range of a legislator's interests. The choice of bills was made with a preference for ratified (enacted into law) bills.

Every effort has been made to verify sources and to rectify apparent discrepancies. We publish this book solely for the purpose of making information about state legislators more accessible, and thus more meaningful, to the people of North Carolina.

#### **How To Use This Book**

#### **General Use**

Profiles of the members of the North Carolina General Assembly are ordered alphabetically within the sections designated Senate and House of Representatives. Each profile is arranged systematically and includes specific information under various self-explanatory headings. The legislator's party affiliation, county of residence, counties in district, district, addresses, date of birth, seat number, and telephone numbers are listed below his or her name. Terms served in the chamber of which the legislator is a member are noted to the right, with any terms served in the other chamber listed in parentheses. Additional information explaining portions of the profile data is detailed below under headings keyed to the profiles themselves.

- If you desire information about a particular legislator, simply turn to the page on which his or her profile is placed in alphabetical sequence.
- If you desire information about legislators representing a particular Senate or House district, use the index by district which appears at the beginning of the section for each chamber and then locate the legislator's profile according to alphabetical sequence.
- If you desire information about legislators who represent various regions of the state, use the map which appears at the beginning of the section for each chamber to determine which districts are in that region. Use the index by district to identify the legislators representing those districts, and then locate each legislator's profile in alphabetical sequence.

#### Selected Bills Introduced 1993-94

For re-elected members, the number and the abbreviated title of five representative bills introduced by the legislator during the 1993–94 term appear in this section. Bills listed are *public* bills for which the legislator was the principal sponsor. If the legislator introduced fewer than five public bills, then local bills are also listed. "Action" indicated is the final disposition of the bill as of the end of the 1994 summer session. Any bill/resolution not ratified automatically expires at the conclusion of each biennial term of the General Assembly. A key for interpreting the "Action" column appears below:

#### Where He/She Stands 1993-94...

Fourteen bills which generated statewide attention during the 1993–94 sessions are listed on each legislator's profile, along with an indication of the vote on the measure in the appropriate chamber and the vote cast by the legislator, if he or she were a member during that session.

- H 120, Open Meetings Law Changes: To make more meetings of elected or appointed officials and other public bodies open to the public. Sessions may be closed to the public for seven reasons including the discussion of confidential information, matters protected by the attorney-client privilege, location of new/expanding industries, negotiations concerning real property or employment contracts, and criminal investigations. If the law is violated, courts may award attorneys' fees to a successful plaintiff, requiring that the fee be paid personally by member(s) of the public body. The vote to adopt the conference report passed the House 107–3 and the Senate 40–6. Ratified 6/23/94.
- H 214, Abolish Spousal Defense to Rape and Sexual Offense: To abolish the defense to a prosecution for rape or sexual offense where the victim is the spouse of the person alleged to have committed the crime. Previously, only if a couple were living separate

and apart could a charge of rape or sexual offense be prosecuted. Third reading (R3) passed the House 101-5. Second reading (R2) passed the Senate 44-3 with no roll-call vote on R3. Ratified 7/5/93.

- H 277, Structured Sentencing: To enact a comprehensive sentencing structure for the criminal justice system that increases the certainty and predictability of punishment. Each defendant is required to serve a minimum term, with felony sentences being determined based on the class of the felony and the prior record of the defendant. The bill also defines misdemeanors and their sentencing ranges. Second reading (R2) passed the House 91–2 with no roll-call vote on R3. Third reading (R3) passed the Senate 37–0. Ratified 7/24/93.
- H 957, Regulate Smoking in Public: To regulate smoking in public places by designating smoking and nonsmoking areas. Generally, 20 percent of interior space must be designated a smoking area and smoking in a nonsmoking area is punishable by a fine not to exceed \$25. Third reading (R3) passed the House 80–33 and in the Senate 24–15. Ratified 7/17/93.
- H 1008, Increase Penalties for Weapons at School/Safe Storage of Firearms: To make it a felony to carry a firearm or explosive on school or other educational property and to make it a felony to cause, encourage, or aid a minor to possess/carry a firearm or explosive on school or other educational property. Also makes it a misdemeanor to (1) improperly store a firearm if a minor resides on the premises and (2) fail to warn a person of this law upon retail sale/transfer of a firearm. Third reading (R3) passed the House 78–28. Second reading (R2) passed the Senate 35–4 with no roll-call vote on R3. Ratified 7/24/93.
- —H 1062, Prohibit Death Penalty for Mentally Retarded: To prohibit a defendant who is mentally retarded from being sentenced to death. Mental retardation determinations would have been made by a jury and the IQ measure of 70 or below would have been a component of the definition of mental retardation. The vote to adopt the conference report passed the House 78–7 but failed in the Senate 16–18.
- H 1776, Voter Registration Rewrite: To create a new voter registration system to comply with the National Voter Registration Act of 1993 (NVRA) and increase voter registration. Requires registration by mail, registration at public agencies, and a uniform system of updating registration rolls. Second reading (R2) passed the House 74–35 and the Senate 27–15. Ratified 7/16/94.
- S 11, Submit State Lottery to Voter Referendum: To establish a state lottery after a binding public referendum. At least 50 percent of the total annual revenues would be returned to the public as prizes, no more than 16 percent would pay for lottery expenses, and the balance would go to Educational Technology Endowment Funds for the public schools, community colleges, and universities. The bill passed the third reading (R3) in the Senate 25-21 and died in the House Committee on Constitutional Amendments and Referenda without a vote on the House floor.

- S 25, Submit Gubernatorial Veto to Voter Referendum: To grant the governor veto power over bills passed by the General Assembly. The veto would not apply to bills concerning constitutional amendments, certain appointments by the legislature, joint resolutions, or redistricting. A three-fifths majority of those present and voting would be required to override the gubernatorial veto. If it had passed, the proposed constitutional amendment on veto power would have been submitted to the voters in a public referendum. Second reading (R2) passed the Senate 45–4. [R3 also passed 40–2]. No vote was ever taken in the House, and the bill died in committee.
- —S 28, Amend the Constitution Altering Public School Governance Structure: The bill voted on in the Senate changed the membership of the State Board of Education to nine members appointed by the Governor and eight members appointed by the legislature. It also would have made the Superintendent an appointee of the State Board. Third reading (R3) passed the Senate 42–7.

The House Committee Substitute would have made the State Board of Education an advisory board, vesting an elected Superintendent with the power to administer the public school system. If it had passed, the proposed constitutional amendment would have been submitted to the voters in a public referendum. Third reading (R3) passed the House 73–36. The House bill was tabled in the Senate.

- S 873, No Obstructing a Person's Access to Health Facilities: To make it a misdemeanor to prevent someone from entering or leaving a health care facility. Violators may be punished with a fine of up to \$500, imprisonment up to 6 months, or both. The bill does not prohibit lawful speech or picketing. Third reading (R3) passed the House 76–25 and the Senate passed this House Committee Substitute 28–15. Ratified 7/20/93.
- S 906, Workers' Compensation Reform Act of 1994: To amend the Workers' Compensation Act, which provides compensation benefits for industrial injuries. Amends the act to achieve cost savings by controlling medical fees, providing criminal penalties for fraud, and reducing administrative costs. The bill also makes changes in the payment system, explains how to terminate or suspend benefits, and allows a period of time for a trial return to work. Third reading (R3) passed the Senate 25–12 and the House 113–0. Ratified 7/5/94.
- —S 1384, Substantive Changes to Smart Start: The mission of the Smart Start Program is to provide, through public and private means, high quality early childhood education and development services. The bill requires that local projects be geographically distributed, and each local project will be coordinated by a new local partnership. Local partnerships must inform those who provide services of their duty to report suspected child abuse or neglect. Seventy-five percent of a local partnership's resources must be used to provide direct services, and the list of day care services for which local partnerships may use their resources is expanded. Generally, resources shall not be used for major capital expenditures and state funds

allocated to local partnerships shall not supplant current expenditures by counties. Second reading (R2) passed the Senate 35–6 and the House 71–18. Ratified 7/16/94.

— S 1563, Campaign Disclosure — Donors' Occupations Required: To require that donors who give more than \$100 to political candidates disclose to the public their occupation, employer's name, and business address in reports filed by the candidates with the State Board of Election's Campaign Reporting Office. Also requires the disclosure of the name of any labor union of which the contributor is a member. The maximum campaign contribution would have been reduced from \$4,000 to \$1,000. Third reading (R3) passed the Senate 43–5. The bill died in the House Judiciary I Committee without a vote on the House floor.

#### **Effectiveness Ranking**

Statistical results of the Center's legislator effectiveness survey appear in Appendix A. The N.C. Center for Public Policy Research conducted its legislative survey during the fall of 1993, after adjournment of the regular session. All state Senators, Representatives, legislative liaisons and lobbyists based in North Carolina, and capital news correspondents were asked to rate the "effectiveness" of each member of the North Carolina General Assembly on a scale of 1 to 10. Senators were only asked to rate other Senators, and Representatives only rated fellow Representatives.

Eighty-six of the House members (72%) responded to the Center's survey, as did 44 of the 50 Senators (88%), 168 of 350 legislative liaisons and registered lobbyists based in North Carolina (48%), and 17 of 33 capital news correspondents (52%). The overall rate of response was 57%. Only 49 members of the Senate were ranked due to the death of Sen. John Codington and only 118 members of the House were ranked due to the deaths of Rep. Pete Thompson and Rep. Herman Gist.

The survey's purpose was to identify the most effective legislators in the General Assembly. The Center asked respondents to base their ratings on legislators' participation in committee work, their skill at guiding bills through floor debate, their general knowledge and expertise in specific fields, the respect they command from peers, the enthusiasm with which they execute various legislative responsibilities, the political power they hold (either by virtue of office, longevity, or personal attributes), their ability to sway the opinion of fellow legislators, and their aptitude for the overall legislative process. Respondents were asked to use these criteria, as well as their own personal knowledge of the General Assembly and personal perceptions of those who serve there, in replying to the Center's questionnaire. Rankings from previous legislative sessions are included where applicable.

Also, the name of the "most powerful" committees in each chamber and "most influential" lobbyists in the General Assembly, as determined by the survey, appear in Appendix A.





# **Effectiveness Survey Results**

Tabulated results of the Center's 1993 legislative survey appear on the following pages. Senators, Representatives, lobbyists, legislative liaisons, and capital news correspondents were asked to rate the "effectiveness" of each member of the General Assembly. Senators were only asked to rate other Senators, and Representatives only rated fellow Representatives. A total of 552 questionnaires were sent and 315 responses were received.

The poll was conducted by the Center during the fall of 1993, after adjournment of the regular session. At that time, 169 (one less than the full 170 due to a death in the House) incumbent legislators, 350 registered lobbyists (including some state agency legislative liaisons), and 33 state capital news correspondents were asked to rate on a scale of 1 to 10 the "effectiveness" of the individual members of each chamber. Respondents were also asked to indicate, in order of priority, the "most powerful" committees in each chamber, and the "most influential" lobbyists in the General Assembly.

The survey's purpose was to identify the most effective legislators in the General Assembly. Ratings were to be based on their participation in committee work, their skill at guiding bills through floor debate, their general knowledge and expertise in special fields, the respect they command from peers, the enthusiasm with which they execute various legislative responsibilities, the political power they hold (either by virtue of office, longevity, or personal attributes), their ability to sway the opinion of fellow legislators, and their aptitude for the overall legislative process. Respondents were asked to use these criteria, as well as their own personal knowledge of the General Assembly and personal perceptions of those who serve there, in replying to the Center's questionnaire. An exact statistical tabulation of the survey results, by respondent group, appears on the following pages.

# **Additional Survey Results 1993**

In addition to asking those surveyed to rank legislators' effectiveness, the Center asked respondents three additional questions. The legislators, lobbyists, and capital news correspondents were asked to name the most powerful committees in the Senate, the most powerful committees in the House of Representatives, and the most influential lobbyists in the 1993 General Assembly.

#### Six "Most Powerful" Senate Committees

- 1. Appropriations
