To the Reader

An informed electorate is the essence of democratic government, but more than a general understanding of important issues is required if government is to fully serve the public's interests. Informed citizens must also know something about the men and women elected to serve them as legislators. This book has been prepared to acquaint the people of North Carolina with their state senators and representatives.

The eleventh edition of Article II provides concise, yet comprehensive, information about each member of the 1997-98 North Carolina General Assembly. The first edition covered the 1977-78 legislature. Each senator and representative has been individually profiled in a manner that will quickly tell the reader:

- how to contact each legislator by mail or telephone;
- the legislator's occupation and educational background;
- what kind of bills the legislator introduced in 1995-96, and his or her success in getting them passed; and
- how he or she voted on a range of issues of statewide interest during the past two sessions.

In addition, members of the General Assembly who served in the 1995 session and other sessions since 1977 were ranked according to the results of a survey of the "effectiveness" of each senator and representative.

All of this information has been organized so it can be readily understood and interpreted, and so legislative activities of various incumbents can be easily compared. Sources used in the preparation of Article II include: (1) The North Carolina Manual, prepared by the Office of the Secretary of State; (2) the North Carolina General Assembly Senate and House Rules Directories; (3) Southern Bell Telephone Company's N.C. Legislative Directory; (4) publications of the Institute of Government, including the Daily Bulletin, North Carolina Legislation 1995, and North Carolina Legislation 1996; (5) the Senate Journal and the House Journal for the 1995-96 session; (6) the North Carolina General Assembly Research Division's Summaries of Substantive Ratified Legislation; (7) Center survey of first-term legislators; (8) official role call vote sheets kept in the legislative library; (9) lists of bills by introducer; and (10) various legislative listings produced by the principal clerks for the House and Senate of the North Carolina General Assembly.

Every effort has been made to verify sources and to rectify apparent discrepancies. Each legislator was given the opportunity to review the information in draft form for accuracy. We publish this book solely for the purpose of making information about state legislators more accessible, and thus more meaningful, to the people of North Carolina.

How To Use This Book

General Use

Profiles of the members of the North Carolina General Assembly are ordered alphabetically within the sections designated Senate and House of Representatives. Each profile is arranged systematically and includes specific information under various self-explanatory headings. The legislator's party affiliation, district, county of residence, date of birth, counties in district, addresses, and telephone numbers are listed below his or her name. Terms served in the chamber of which the legislator is a member are noted to the right, with any terms served in the other chamber listed in parentheses. Additional information explaining portions of the profile data is detailed below under headings keyed to the profiles themselves.

- If you desire information about a particular legislator, simply turn to the page on which his or her profile is placed in alphabetical sequence.
- If you desire information about legislators representing a particular Senate or House district, use the index by district which appears at the beginning of the section for each chamber and then locate the legislator's profile according to alphabetical sequence.
- If you desire information about legislators who represent various regions of the state, use the map which appears at the beginning of the section for each chamber to determine which districts are in that region. Use the index by district to identify the legislators representing those districts, and then locate each legislator's profile in alphabetical sequence.

Selected Bills Introduced 1995-96

For re-elected members, the number and the abbreviated title of five representative bills introduced by the legislator during the 1995-96 sessions appear in this section. Bills listed are public bills for which the legislator was the *principal* bill sponsor. If the legislator introduced fewer than five public bills, then local bills also are listed. The choice of bills was made with a preference for ratified (enacted into law) bills. "Action" indicated is the final disposition of the bill as of the end of the 1996 second extra session. Any bill/resolution not ratified automatically expires at the conclusion of each biennial term of the General Assembly. A key for interpreting the "Action" column appears below:

Where He/She Stands 1995-96

Fifteen bills which generated statewide attention during the 1995-96 sessions are listed on each legislator's profile, along with an indication of the vote on the measure in the appropriate chamber and the vote cast by the legislator, if he or she was a member at the time the vote was taken.

- H 2, Income Tax Cut/Child Care Tax Credit: Increases the personal exemption deduction from state income tax by \$500 and allows a tax credit of \$60 per dependent child. This bill provides a reduction in taxes to low- and middle-income citizens because it only affects taxpayers whose adjusted gross income is less than a specified amount. It reduces the number of people who pay taxes and the total amount of individual income tax collected. Second reading (R2) passed the Senate 43-1 with no roll-call vote on R3. The House passed the Senate Committee Substitute 108-1. Ratified 4/18/95.
- H 10, Allow Referendum on Voter Initiatives: To amend the Constitution of North Carolina to give the people the power of initiative. This would have enabled citizens to initiate changes in the constitution without General Assembly approval if a petition was (a) signed by voters equal in number to 25 percent of the votes cast for governor in the most recent election and (b) not more than one-quarter of those petitioners resided in the same congressional district. An initiative would have to receive a three-fifths favorable vote of those voting on it to be successful. Second reading (R2)

failed the House 70-42 (a 3/5 vote of the 120 members of the House is required to pass constitutional amendments).

- H 12, Term Limits for Legislators: To amend the Constitution of North Carolina in provide term limits for legislators. This would have limited to six the number of consecutive terms a member could serve in each house. The vote in the House of Representatives was on term limits only. Third reading (R3) passed the House 78-37. The Senate Committee Substitute limited total consecutive service in both houses to six terms, did not allow a grace term -- an extra term -- for members whose service already totaled more than six years, and tied term limits to extensive campaign finance reform legislation, including spending limits. Thus, the vote in the Senate was on term limits and campaign finance reform. Second reading (R2) in the Senate failed 26-23 (a 3/5 vote of the 50 members of the Senate is required to pass constitutional amendments).
- H 90, Allows Concealed Handgun Permits: To allow citizens to carry concealed handguns if they obtain a permit. To carry a concealed weapon, a person must have a permit and personal identification in his or her possession. Permits are valid statewide for four years. This bill outlines the application, issuance, and revocation process for the permits, as well as criminal penalties for violations of the law. Third reading (R3) passed the Senate 36-9. The House concurred in the Senate Committee Substitute 90-18. Ratified 7/10/95.
- H 481, Parental Consent for Abortion: To require parental or judicial consent before an unemancipated minor may obtain abortion. Physicians may not perform an abortion unless they have written consent of the minor and either parental consent or a court order waiving the consent requirement. Third reading (R3) passed the Senate 41-7. The House concurred in the Senate Committee Substitute 96-10. Ratified 7/20/95.
- H 729, Punitive Damages/Tort Reform: To establish standards and procedures for the recovery of punitive damages in North Carolina. For punitive damages to be awarded, the defendant in a civil suit must be liable for compensatory damages and an aggravating factor fraud, malice, or willful and wanton conduct must be established. Punitive damages are awarded to punish the losing party for egregious behavior, and compensatory damages are designed to compensate the victim for the damage done to them. The maximum allowed for punitive damages is capped at \$250,000 or three times the amount of compensatory damages, whichever is greater. Passed the Senate on second and third readings (R2 and R3) 32-13. The House concurred in the Senate Committee Substitute 72-33. Ratified 7/29/95.
- H 834, Teach Abstinence Until Marriage: To require public schools to offer an "abstinence until marriage" program. This bill substantially changes the health education program offered in the public schools, while recognizing that parents have the primary responsibility for health education. It requires the State Board of Education to develop a comprehensive program for students in grades K-9. The program must teach that abstinence

from sexual activity outside of marriage is expected for all students; present reasons, skills, and strategies for remaining abstinent; teach that abstinence is the only certain method of preventing out-of-wedlock pregnancy and sexually transmitted diseases; and teach the positive benefits of abstinence until marriage. Passed the Senate on second and third readings (R2 and R3) 38-4. The House concurred in the Senate Committee Substitute 80-12. Ratified 7/29/95.

- H 879, State Gun Regulation/Preempt Local Governments: To amend the state's gun laws to establish statewide, uniform regulations. Because the regulation of firearms is deemed to be an issue of general, statewide concern, this bill preempts regulation by local governments. The statewide regulations cover possession, ownership, storage, transfer, sale, purchase, licensing, registration of firearms, ammunition, and dealers. Passed the Senate on second and third readings (R2 and R3) 40-9. The House concurred in the Senate Committee Substitute 78-20. Ratified 6/21/96.
- H 955, Charter Schools: To create and fund charter schools, which are deregulated schools under public control. Charter school are governed by Boards of Directors of private, nonprofit organizations, not by local school boards. These schools will provide more parental choice in education, because generally they will differ from traditional public schools in their mission, educational philosophy, or instructional techniques. The State Board of Education is authorized to approve up to 100 charter schools across the state. The Conference Committee Report was adopted by the House 78-25 and by the Senate 37-8. Ratified 6/21/96.
- S 3, Allows Referendum on Gubernatorial Veto: To authorize a statewide referendum to amend the Constitution of North Carolina to grant veto power to the Governor. The amendment provides a general veto power not a line-item veto. It requires most statewide legislation to be submitted to the Governor for his approval. State and federal constitutional amendments, local legislation, joint resolutions, and appointments are exempt. If the Governor vetoes a bill, the General Assembly could override the veto by a three-fifths vote of the members of each house present and voting. The conference committee report was adopted by the Senate on third reading (R3) 45-3 and by the House on third reading (R3) 97-18. Ratified 3/8/95 and approved by the voters on 11/5/96.
- S 5, Appoint, Not Elect, Superintendent of Public Instruction: To amend the Constitution of North Carolina to make the Superintendent of Public Instruction an appointive, not elective position. The Superintendent currently is elected by the voters in North Carolina to a four-year term. Under this bill, the State Board of Education would have appointed the superintendent, who would serve at the pleasure of the Board. This bill also would have made changes in the composition of the State Board of Education. Passed the Senate on third reading (R3) 47-0. Failed in the House on third reading (R3) 70-40 (a 3/5 vote of the 120

members of the House is required to pass constitutional amendments).

- S 8, Repeal Intangibles Tax: To repeal the intangibles tax and to reimburse local governments for their resulting loss in revenue. Effective for taxes due on April 15, 1996, this bill repeals the state intangibles tax on stocks, bonds, mutual funds, and accounts receivable, a tax reduction of an estimated \$125 million per year. Each year, \$93 million of the state's General Fund will be distributed to local governments to replace this lost revenue. Passed the Senate on third reading (R3) 48-0 and passed the House on third reading (R3) 99-16. Ratified 4/18/95.
- S 624, Allow Binding Referendum on State Lottery: Would have allowed a binding public referendum on whether to establish a state lottery. If approved by the voters, the lottery would have returned at least 50 percent of the total annual revenues to the public as prizes, allowed no more than 16 percent of total annual revenues to be spent on lottery expenses, and transferred the net revenue quarterly to the School Construction Fund, which would help county governments pay for building public schools or other capital needs. Failed second reading (R2) in the Senate 19-
- S 971, Appoint, Not Elect, Appellate Court Judges: To amend the Constitution of North Carolina to provide for gubernatorial appointment of justices of the Supreme Court and judges of the Court of Appeals. As passed by the Senate, this bill would have provided for gubernatorial appointment of appellate judges, with legislative confirmation of the governor's nominees. After sitting on the bench, a vote on whether to retain the judge would be held. Passed the Senate on third reading (R3) 42-6, but failed in the House on second reading (R2) 62-43.
- —S 1271, Approve Animal Waste Commission

 Recommendations: To implement recommendations of the blue ribbon study commission on swine farms and other livestock and poultry operations. Among many other provisions, this bill establishes guidelines for farm operations with animal waste management systems, increases penalties for the willful discharge of pollutants into public waters, and increases setback requirements of hog operations from neighboring homes, schools, businesses, and churches. Passed third reading (R3) in the Senate 43-5 and passed second and third readings (R2 and R3) in the House 103-2. Ratified 6/21/96.

Effectiveness Ranking

Statistical results of the Center's legislator effectiveness survey in Appendix A. The N.C. Center for Public Policy Research conducted its biennial legislative survey during the fall of 1995, after adjournment of the regular long session. All state Senators, Representatives, legislative liaisons and lobbyists based in North Carolina, and capital news correspondents were asked to rate the "effectiveness" of each member of the North Carolina General Assembly on a scale of one to ten. Senators were only asked to rate other Senators, and Representatives only rated fellow Representatives.

Ninety-four of the 120 House members (78%) responded to the Center's survey, as did 40 of the 50 Senators (80%), 148 of the 371 legislative liaisons and registered lobbyists based in North Carolina (40%), and 8 of 26 capital news correspondents (31%). The overall rate of response was 51 percent. Only 49 members of the Senate were ranked due to the death of Sen. Thomas B. Sawyer, Sr. (R-Guilford) and only 119 members of the House were ranked due to the death of Rep. Macon S. Snowden (R-Carteret).

The survey's purpose was to identify the most effective legislators in the General Assembly. The Center asked respondents to base their ratings on legislators' participation in committee work, their skill at guiding bills through floor debate, their general knowledge and expertise in specific fields, the respect they command from peers, the enthusiasm with which they execute various legislative responsibilities, the political power they hold (either by virtue of office, longevity, or personal attributes), their ability to sway the opinion of fellow legislators, and their aptitude for the overall legislative process. Respondents were asked to use these criteria, as well as their own personal knowledge of the General Assembly and personal perceptions of those who serve there, in replying to the Center's questionnaire. Rankings from the previous legislative sessions are included where applicable.

Also, the name of the "most powerful" committees in each chamber and "most influential" lobbyists in the General Assembly, as determined by the survey, appear in Appendix A.

Effectiveness Survey Results

Tabulated results of the Center's 1995 legislative survey appear on the following pages. Senators, Representatives, lobbyists, legislative liaisons, and capital news correspondents were asked to rate the "effectiveness" of each member of the General Assembly. Senators were asked only to rate other Senators, and Representatives rated only fellow members of the House. A total of 567 questionnaires were sent and 290 responses were received.

The poll was conducted by the Center during the fall of 1995, after adjournment of the regular session. At that time, 170 incumbent legislators, 371 registered lobbyists (including some state agency legislative liaisons), and 26 state capital news correspondents were asked to rate on a scale of one to ten the "effectiveness" of the individual members of each chamber. Respondents were also asked to indicate, in order of priority, the "most powerful" committees in each chamber, and the "most influential" lobbyists in the General Assembly.

The survey's purpose was to identify the most effective legislators in the General Assembly. Respondents were asked to base their ratings on legislators' participation in committee work, their skill at guiding bills through floor debate, their general knowledge and expertise in special fields, the respect they command from peers, the enthusiasm with which they execute various legislative responsibilities, the political power they hold (by virtue of office, longevity, or personal attributes), their ability to sway the opinion of fellow legislators, and their aptitude for the overall legislative process. Respondents were asked to use these criteria, as well as their own personal knowledge of the General Assembly and personal perceptions of those who serve there, in replying to the Center's questionnaire. An exact statistical tabulation of the survey, by respondent group, appears on the following pages.

The 50 Most Influential Lobbyists

The most influential lobbyist ranking is based on a point system that gives weight to the rating the lobbyist received upon being mentioned by a respondent, e.g., first place rating = 20 points, second place =18 points, etc. Like the effectiveness rating of legislators, ratings given by the three respondent groups — legislators, lobbyists, and capital news correspondents — are considered equally.
