

Methodology and Response Rates for the Survey Identifying the Most Influential Lobbyists in the 2005 Legislative Session



The N.C. Center for Public Policy Research conducted its legislative survey during January, February and March of 2006. At that time, all 50 state Senators, 120 Representatives, 442 registered lobbyists (including the lead state agency legislative liaisons), and 16 state capital news correspondents were asked to list the 10 most influential lobbyists and/or state agency legislative liaisons during the 2005 session of the North Carolina General Assembly.

Eighty-one of the 120 House members (68%) responded to the Center's survey, as did 36 of the 50 Senators (72%), 173 of the 442 lobbyists and lead legislative liaisons based in North Carolina (39%), and 10 of 16 capital news correspondents (63%). The overall response rate was 48%.

At the end of the 2005 session, 638 lobbyists were registered with the Secretary of State, representing 727 different companies or organizations. The Center's calculations of the number of lobbyists count each lobbyist only once, even if they represent more than one client. There were also 68 legislative liaisons, representing 40 different state government agencies and licensing boards, registered with the Secretary of State.

The following pages list the most influential lobbyists during the 2005 North Carolina General Assembly, as ranked by legislators, fellow lobbyists, and capital news correspondents. Where applicable, rankings from previous legislative sessions are included. If the lobbyist is a former legislator or a lawyer, that also is indicated.






