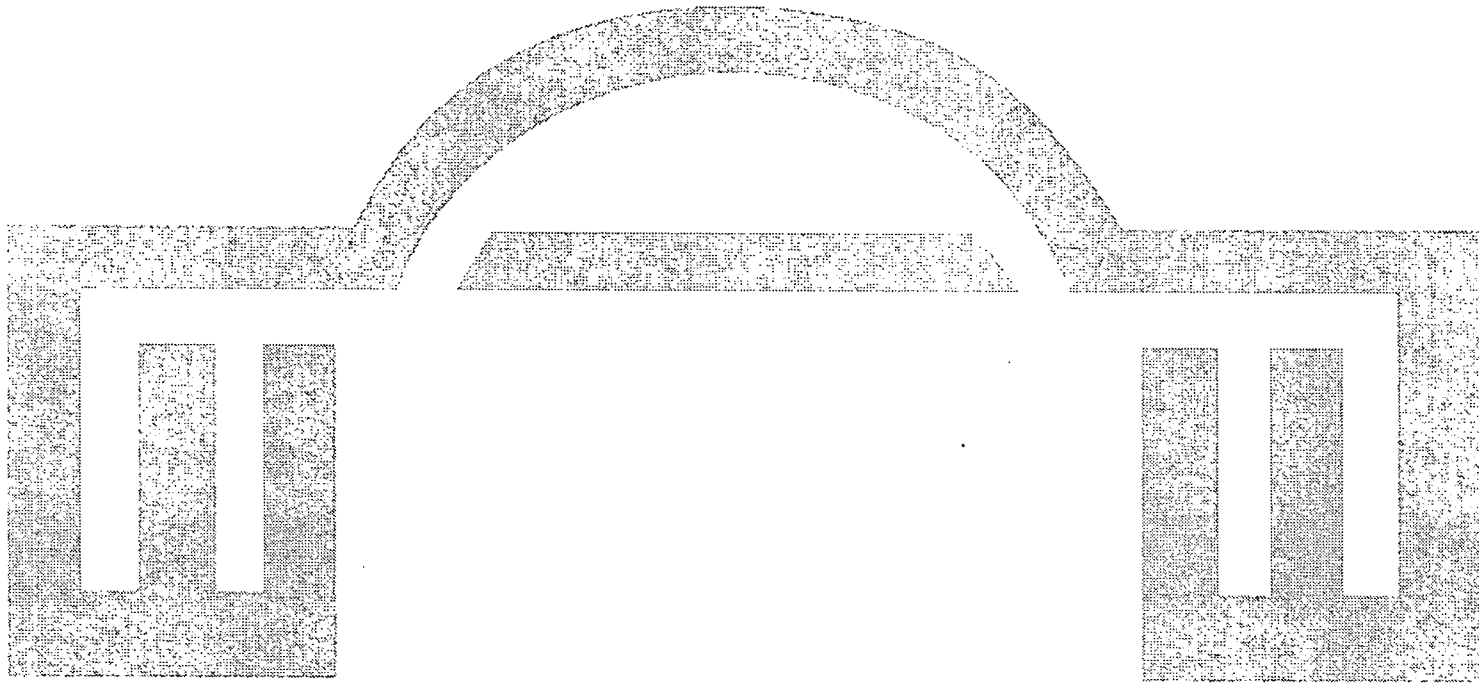

Effectiveness Rankings for Members of the 1999 N.C. General Assembly

The N.C. Center for Public Policy Research conducted its legislative survey during the fall of 1999, after adjournment of the regular session. All state Senators and Representatives, 328 legislative liaisons and lobbyists based in North Carolina, and 28 capital news correspondents were asked to rate the "effectiveness" of each member of the North Carolina General Assembly on a scale of 1 to 10. Senators were asked only to rate other Senators, and Representatives only rated fellow Representatives.

Eighty-four of the 120 House members (70%) responded to the Center's survey, as did 37 of the 50 Senators (74%), 142 of 328 legislative liaisons and registered lobbyists based in North Carolina (43%), and 7 of 28 capital news correspondents (25%). The overall rate of response was 51%.

The survey's purpose was to identify the most effective legislators in the General Assembly. The Center asked respondents to base their ratings on legislators' participation in committee work, their skill at guiding bills through floor debate, their general knowledge and expertise in specific fields, the respect they command from peers, the enthusiasm with which they execute various legislative responsibilities, the political power they hold (either by virtue of office, longevity, or personal attributes), their ability to sway the opinion of fellow legislators, and their aptitude for the overall legislative process. Respondents were asked to use these criteria, as well as their own personal knowledge of the General Assembly and personal perceptions of those who serve there, in replying to the Center's questionnaire.

The following pages list the effectiveness rankings for the 1999 North Carolina Senate and House of Representatives and include rankings from previous legislative sessions where applicable.

An attempt is made in the various projects undertaken by the Center to synthesize the thoroughness of scholarly research with the readability of good journalism. Each Center publication represents an effort to amplify conflicting ideas on the subject under study and to reach conclusions based on sound rationalization of these competing ideas.
